





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TUGGING AT OUR HEARTSTRINGS

Josh Kua is an international violinist and model who is based in Melbourne, Australia. However, this talented Law graduate has roots closer to our homes, as he was born right here in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. He started his violin training at the tender age of four, and he has since performed and modelled in various countries within the Asian region. In fact, earlier this year, he had performed his first solo concert titled Relentless at KLPAC, Sentul. Despite his outstanding achievements, Josh remains as a down to earth individual and his charm is evident during the following interview.

### **COVER STORY**



### How would you describe your music?

Since I started writing my own music, it seems my style has evolved from more acoustic to contain more electronic and pop elements. It still sounds a little bit classical because of the strings, which some people may associate as orchestral. Truth be told, I find difficulty in describing what genre it is, because I try to not fit under any specific label. I enjoy the freedom that comes with it, which enables me to be more diverse with my music.

### What triggered your interest for music?

According to my parents, when I was four years old, I became interested when I came across someone playing the violin on TV. I told them that I wanted to learn the instrument, so my parents let me start tuition at a young age. Eventually, I picked up the piano too, which came quite easily after learning to play the violin.

## Would you say you have a preference for your violin over the piano?

I do not necessarily prefer the violin, because they are two very distinctive instruments. For me, the violin is more expressive because there is just so much more that you can do with it. You can play and manipulate more variables, such as the tone, timbre and style, which I find to be more similar to singing. The sound of the violin is kind of like my voice, and that is just something that I cannot emulate on the piano.

### What were your early musical influences?

As a kid, I initially learnt classical music, but I grew up with Christian pop. I come from a pretty religious family, so we were not allowed to listen much to the radio because of the 'bad influences' and 'adult themes'. I learnt mainly from church. This is where I learnt to improvise, be it to play in a band or for people to sing, whereas my classical training taught me how to play solo.

### When did you decide to pursue music professionally?

When I finished high school, I initially applied for Industrial Design. However, after a year, the stress became overwhelming and that was when I sort of lost my passion for drawing. I then changed to Commerce and Law, because I was still unsure of what I wanted to do. It was during this period that I started to perform at bars, in a band with some friends. Later on, I started modelling too, and during my third year, I was able to come to Malaysia to perform solo for a fashion event. That was when it really started for me, and for the next two years, I started to perform more overseas and I started to seriously consider this as a career. When I graduated in mid-2014, I decided that I would dedicate myself full time to pursuing music.

## Was it an easy decision to make, to take that leap from law to music?

It was almost an easy choice for me, because first of all, I knew it was something that I truly enjoyed doing. Secondly, I predicted that there would be a struggle for me, as there was and there is an oversupply of law graduates in Australia. In fact, I think it would have been harder for me if I had continued to be a lawyer!

### Tell us a little bit about your first big break.

Has it happened yet? (laughter)

I guess it was the first time I was flown overseas for a gig in 2012, which was for a mini tour in the Philippines. The marketing team did really well, and it showed in the number of girls, and people in general that attended to watch my performance. They were just fangirling for me, and I could not help but ask myself, 'Do they really know who I am?'. It was quite crazy cause I think the fan culture there tends to be very open and loving, so they were asking me to sign everything, plus the meet-and-greet just went on for ages. It was a really new and fun experience for me.





## And now you are an international violinist and model! Run us through the process of reaching this stage of your life.

So, after the tour in the Philippines, I got invited to Indonesia. I went on live TV for the first time and I also had my first ever fashion shoot there, which was for Harper's Bazaar. And just when I thought it could not get better, I landed a Nivea campaign in Thailand. Eventually, I ended up returning to Malaysia and doing a lot of work here, and this extended to China as well. I noticed the leverage that being a model provided me with, so I used it to get myself exposed in different countries, and upon establishing myself, I would then try to push my music in as well.

Over the years, I ended up performing a lot for other people. However, back in April, I was finally able to conduct my very own solo concert, here in Malaysia. It was a new start for me because previously, I had never really pushed my agenda as a performing artist as seriously as I did here for that concert.

## Speaking of the concert, how was the experience of performing in Relentless?

It was a big learning curve. The biggest thing I learnt with conducting a concert is the importance of coordination and attention to details. There were a lot of different elements that had to come together perfectly, and that was a big issue for us because we did not have enough time to prepare. But at the end of the day, I believe we achieved what we set out for and that was to give a really good performance. It was rewarding to see what we had initially conceptualised, finally came to life on stage and subsequently being enjoyed by the audience as well.

### We hear that you will be releasing your first EP soon.

Tentatively, I am planning to release the EP in May next year. I have two songs which I have completed and in fact, I performed them during my concert. I also have three more which are still in the works. It has been a really positive process thus far, because prior to this, I had focused mainly on covers, so I look forward to being able to perform more original work in the future.

## As an international performer, what was your main asset in making a breakthrough in so many different countries?

I find that being a musician is a big advantage for me. People are always asking me, 'Do you sing?' to which the answer would be, 'No, I don't sing'. I have come to a realisation that it was the fact that I did not have any words with my music that had enabled me to access so many diverse countries, due to the absence of a language barrier. Music is universal after all, so that really worked out well for me.

## The influence of an artist is ever expanding in today's age. What are your thoughts?

I believe that being an artist is a big responsibility. There are a lot of people who look up to you, so you have to really consider the type of material that you are putting out there. There are certain issues that I feel very strongly about, such as social justice, and I do hope that I can become a bigger advocate for it when I am able to have more followers. At the current moment, I can't really speak explicitly on a lot of things as I am at the early stages of my career. I am still working on my brand image, and that involves the values I portray as well.

## You mentioned your brand image. What is the Josh Kua image that you are striving for?

I would like to project an image of quality, authenticity and minimalism. I would like to think that despite all the 'glamour' that comes with being a performer, I still try to be 'me'. I am not the type to indulge in fanfare and gimmicks. I try my best to be relatable to my audience, especially through my social media, which I manage personally myself.

### What is your biggest goal in life?

To be a voice for those who can't be helped. I believe someone needs to advocate for those who can't advocate for themselves, eg. the poor, the needy, the marginalised, the minorities.

### Who is your favourite musician?

I really like John Mayer. I managed to watch him live once, and he was really good. I really like how every time he does perform, there is a different spin to it. Oh, and Frank Ocean too.

### If you could collaborate with anyone, who would it be?

Beyonce, cause she is Beyonce. I think I could contribute a new element to her music. Based on what I have been listening to currently, I also would like to collaborate with Zara Larrson, Shawn Mendes and Parson James too if I have the chance.

### If you weren't a musician, what career path would you have taken?

An aquarium designer.

### I did not see that coming. Out of curiosity, my next question would be, why?

I have always been fascinated with underwater ecosystems and the architecture that comes with it. There was this one occasion where my mom had lost me in a shopping centre, and she later found me staring at the mall's fish tank for ages. I admit, it is a little weird, but if music doesn't work out, I am just going to go to Japan and do aqua-scaping instead!

### What words of wisdom could you share with aspiring artistes out there?

Do not underestimate the power of social media. I started by setting up my own Facebook fan page, and that was how people started to know more about me. Nowadays, there are bigger platforms like Instagram that you can utilise. Of course, you must work hard at your craft, so that the quality of your work can improve. But to be honest, if you really do want to make music your career, you have to pay attention to marketing. You can work hard as much you want, but that may end up translating into nothing without the right marketing of your talent.



Beyond his profile as a racer, he is also a writer, fitness enthuthiast and more notably he is now raising breast cancer awareness with the Pink Ribbon Wellness (L) Foundation in collaboration with Absolute Racing for Porsche Carrera Cup Asia.

I started racing when I was 6 and since then I've been travelling around the world chasing my dreams. # Share with us a few of your favourite dining places, or even coffee haunts. What are your favourite dishes there?





Though if you want to renact the iconic movie moment yourself, instead off spending hours long flights, you can simply visit BLVD House, where the real magic takes form in their gastonomic offerings.

BLVD House was established five months ago with an interesting concept of elevated casual with a twist. As soon as you walk in, you can't help but notice there are certain elements that seem familiar if you've visited the chicest bars in Paris, New York and London or just watched a lot of Christmas Hallmark movies (like me). The opulent venue encompasses a beautiful main bar, furniture of unembellished wood and brass, alass and louvered doors and upholstery and stone, spoilling you with plenty of room to relax throughout the week over a bite of eat with friends and ample space to feel free from your dayto-day hustle.

#### Our Feast!

Our immediate first impression of the menu was that the selections would be made as sharing platters. The selections here are definitely worth the journey into Kuala Lumpur as BLVD House carries a plethora of contemporary dishes that are innovative and distinctive.

#### Menu Highlights

#### **Truffleicious Country Fries**

I simply will never be able to wrap my head around the fact that such a complex dish was made with only truffle aoili and shaved cheese. The earthy fragrance of the truffle peaked my interest, seducing me to take the bite. As if my hands were on autopilot, I plunged my fork into the pile and dipped my fries into the smooth and velvety truffle cream sauce. It is one of those dishes I think anyone can enjoy.

#### Smoked Duck and Peach Kale Salad

As simple as it may seem to make a salad, it really takes quite a substantial amount of work to incorporate unique and different ingredients to balance out one another. Here we had a salad that could have been satisfying enough to just feature the smoked duck but instead the chef added more complex ingredients such as beetroot, peach slices and kale topped off with walnuts. Using white peach for its delicate sweetness was an ingenious way to elevate the savoury smoked duck. This is the dish you would want to have in the summer (or lunch in Malaysia).

# Chef's Signature Bean Can Toasted Free-Range Baby Chicken

So this signature dish came with a fiery presentation. It was visually enchanting and makes for an enviable social media photo. However, in such a competitive F&B industry especially in KL, it had to stand out beyond that. True enough, it did with the excellent savouriness of the chicken and the juices that dripped into

the bean sauce. With each bite, my memory travelled back to the moment I first laid eyes on the dish engulfed in the beautiful flames that danced on the chicken for a short moment. There is nothing like a show and great food.

# Oozing Ovomaltine Beignets and Vanilla Sugar

A testimony of opposites attract, the hot from the freshly made deep-fried choux pastry with ovomaltine filling dipped in the cold salted caramel ice cream is the epitome of sweet indulgence. The ice cream is from Jersey Jack Gelato which relies on Jersey Milk from Kuala Selangor's Bright Coq dairy farm to whip up a myriad of delicious flavours. Typically, I don't quite favour ice cream due to the cold but it was easy to brave through it with the rich creamy flavour of the salted caramel.

#### Signature Chocolate Drink, XMAS

Yes, it is truly the embodiment of Christmas in a cup. Made with Valhorna Bahibe, it is notable for its exquisite balance of sweetness from the milk and bitter cocoa notes. Furthering the yuletide cheer, ginger and cinnamon were added to level the complexity of the overall nutty hint. For adults, you have the fun option of adding Amaretto (sweet almond-flavoured Italian liquer). Naughty or nice, this drink is a gift from you to you.

It might seem like a dessert at first, but it definitely qualifies as a cocktail because of the balanced taste of malibu rum and coconut cream.

After such a repast, it's difficult to imagine wanting dessert, but who can resist strawberry tartlets, or a chocolate brownie, those hearty goodness of which was designed to shake off the monsoon blues? It certainly worked for me, as I hit the road feeling warm all over.









he moment we stepped into Tanzini at GTower, we were greeted by such an elegant and cosy ambience suited for couples and friends looking to let their hair down after a hard day's work. Walking further into the restaurant, we found ourselves completely enthralled by the view before us. There lay a view of the concrete jungle of Kuala Lumpur at dusk, a shade of pink and orange painted across the skies and the lights emanating from the surrounding buildings. It was an absolutely perfect moment.

With the joyous season close, we had a hankering for the gastronomic pleasures that Christmas has to offer, thus the choice of restaurant. In conjunction with the joyous celebration of the year, Tanzini introduced a modern five-course meal with a twist on the traditional favourites. Tanzini's motto, 'from farm to table' promises its patrons the freshest and highest quality of ingredients on your table.

The scrumptious fare began with a Fresh Trout Carpaccio, a starter made out their fillet trout sashimi flown from Scotland. This starter was garnished with orange and lemon wedges to oxidise the salmon and for that burst of zest, accompanied by trout and dill. Being a fish person, this starter left me revelling in the wonderful matrimony between the salmon sashimi and the citrusy wedges.



Still revelling in this starter, I was presented with a Crab Meat Timbale, a chilled and rich tomato-based soup served with avocados and crabmeat. I loved its opulence in tomato base. The cubes of avocado added depth to the creamy flavour, not to the extent of overpowering the dish. We had to take a minute to acknowledge the power that lay within this chilled soup du jour.

The following starter arrived in several petit red and green ice cream cones

containing the Goose liver & Gin, Saffron Parfait. This imaginative dish was entirely homemade down to the cones. The green cones were made of seaweed and the red cones from beetroot housing the creamiest foié gras mixed with a sundry of wild berries and a dash of saffron, teasing a hint of fragrance and a burst of flavour.

We were then presented with Tanzini Raspberry Sorbet to cleanse the palate from the abounding piquancy. Next was time for the main dish. Guests were given a choice between Rolled Turkey with black salt or the Lamb Crown Pot. We opted for the Lamb Crown Pot. Its presentation was divine, resembling a tree, with the roast lamb being the bark of the tree and the courgette, almond, feta and mint sauce garnishing the dish. There were vegetables embedded underneath the lamb crown, topped with a glaze of mutton oil. This dish encapsulates the very essence of Christmas with its kaleidoscope of colour in its presentation, to the taste and aroma.

To seal the gastronomic fare on a sweet note, we were served a brandy fruit x-mas pudding, an ode to the fruit cake which is a typical Christmas dessert. It was served hot from the oven, with a thick yet soft consistency that just melted int our mouths like going down a waterslide.



veryone loves to be in on a secret, which probably explains why we ended up visiting The Vault, one of the most-talked-about speakeasy bar in town and we're happy to let you in on the details. Taking rumour as our guide we found The Vault nestled in between an eatery and another staircase that lead to a cavern-like interior that transported us into an actual vault (yes, just like in the movie, Now You See Me). Yet again, we were in a state of bewilderment. It took us a good 5 minutes to figure out the entry point. We then found a lever that required turning and lo and behold, the inner sanctum. Its passé interior exuded a certain mystery and coziness. The brick-laden walls, retro switches, lights and an antiquated swing set complemented the setting perfectly.

The bar looked something out of a Game of Thrones set, displaying neatly arranged libations. Completing the interior was its period-style sofas, big stained mirrosr to adorn the wall, an antique speakeasy furniture customised into a DJ console and jazz swing numbers that embody the very essence of a speakeasy and the Prohibition era.

For those of you looking to dust the cobwebs after a hard day's work, this is the place to be. Their cocktails pack a punch, promising a night of fun. Amongst their wide array of quenchers offered, we opted to experience their signature cocktails, named The Erik and Passion Fruit Martini. The Erik, consisted of vodka-infused lemongrass, kaffir lime leaves and cili padi.

Yes, we agree, it does sound rather peculiar. However, after a sip, we had to concede victory. The concoction hinted of lemongrass, blending harmoniously with the citrusy kaffir lime leaf and concluded with a tad of spice. My personal favourite is the the Passion Fruit Martini, suited for both men and women. It embodies a citrus yet sweet element, topped off with a layer of passion fruit purée that will leave you exhaling with sheer contentment.

After a couple of drinks, naturally a symphony started playing in our stomachs, beseeching for food. Thankfully, we were presented with a house signature, the (aptly named) OG grilled cheese sandwich that deserves the limelight for its piquant flavour. This divine dish consists of what I believe to be the perfect matrimony between cheese and bread (other than pizza). The OG grilled cheese sandwich is to be dipped generously into a rich tomato and basil purée. In my humble opinion, the OG sandwich is truly an OG for it left us revelling in its glory.

Next, we tried out The Dynamite, a jalapeno pepper fried to a crisp, loaded with three types of cheeses. Upon biting the fiery jalapeno, the amalgamation of tanginess from the pepper and the creamy cheese exploded in our mouths. The fare didn't end there. We were then offered chicken wings. Needless to say, the chicken wing was a winner in our books for its dulcified depth. It was the perfect accompaniment for our cocktails other than the OG. Need I say more?

Besides serving great cocktails and starters, this trendsetting bar is constantly keeping patrons on their toes by updating its myriad of cocktails and coming up with the most inventive things such as a crystal ball of ice that takes 4 days to make, served with selected cocktails. If you are feeling a little blue, fret not because happy hour is available for those of you who want to have a nip or two after work. To keep the ball rolling, The Vault is constantly keeping its regulars interested by holding ladies' nights (every Tuesday) and even acoustic nights (every Thursday) for a mellow end to the day. Don't be surprised to find rocking DJ's such as the Twinkies who play during the Saturday slots to keep you on your feet.

Hidden behind a secret door on the third floor, lies an exclusive karaoke room for patrons to momentarily live out their musical dreams. Who doesn't love to burst into song after a good buzz, right? Equipped with brown leather sofas and a big TV screen, a glimpse of this room will remind you of The Great Gatsby movie, decadence and all, fit for a night of entertainment.

Patrons should keep an eye open for a VIP members club on the 2nd floor which is expected to open before the New Year. The Vault will be developed into a three-floor exclusive establishment. ### Party your way to fewer pounds

re you looking to spice up your workout routine and have a great time? Flycycle, Mont Kiara is your place to be. Inspired by the revolutionary Soul Cycle trend in the US that has taken the world by storm, Flycyle is set to create its own mark on the country. Being the first indoor cycling establishment in Malaysia, it aims to create happiness and empowerment through an experience that is fuelled by fun and laughter that leaves every rider wanting more.

There are times where it gets rather monotonous jogging on the treadmill or lifting weights at the gym, resulting in a loss of motivation and desire to workout. Spinning at Flycyle is the exact change in pace you require. They provide you with an adrenaline-charged, high-intensity sessions that are specially designed to strengthen your body, tone your core and burn calories. You would be flabbergasted to know that you can lose up to 700 calories during a session, depending on the individual and their resistance. Have I gained your attention yet? What I find noteworthy about this indoor spinning enterprise is the fact that it provides a full-body dynamic workout during the 45-minute session, and all on a cycle. Now that's a way to spruce up vour routine.

If you are worried about the sessions being high in intensity, don't. Although it

may be fast-paced, they encourage you to listen to your body and to follow the instructor to the best of your ability but don't give up, because you will eventually hit that milestone with frequent sessions. After all, practice does make perfect. So newcomers, you need not fret. Initially, it will be a challenge, like every venture you explore but soon after you catch the drift and beat, you will find yourself bobbing your head in delight. Like any other workout, the session starts with a warm-up and progressively increases in intensity.

This cardio party is carefully crafted and choreographed to enable you to ride to the rhythm while making use of weights and body movements to get those upper body muscles toned and popping. During the workout, the lights are dimmed and neon liahts decorate the arena with their vibrant colours as the session picks up pace, resembling a neon nightclub. Upbeat trendy songs accompany the neon lights, guaranteeing an energised, party-filled workout. In hindsight, this journey may be a bumpy one, but you would find that it's quite an entertaining ride. Sometimes, the most difficult journey is the most rewarding one.

Furthermore, the interior of the spinning space is topped with a large mirror decorating the wall in front of the bikes for you to keep check on your performance and it also acts as a form of motivation to push yourself further.

Apart from that, the Schwinn bikes are of great quality and adjustable to individual preferences, so that you are comfortable throughout your session. Cycling shoes with a unique clip-on feature that simulates the real life cycling feel of an outdoor bike in a controlled, hard-pedalling indoor environment are provided at the reception.

I find that the most common practice in most gyms is to work out and leave or to use mobile phones throughout the workout without communicating with fellow gym junkies. However, the founders of Flycyle are determined to break the habit by banning mobile phones during sessions and by making every edge of the reception area a watering hole for interaction. Whatever happened to the good old days when people talked to each other? Also, what's rather adorable and inspiring is that everyday, motivational messages are written on the doors of the in-built personalised lockers, hoping to inspire the patrons to go the extra mile. They clearly have your best interest at heart.

You would also be happy to know that unlike many places, the washrooms in Flycyle are not only clean, but they provide you with the basic amenities that you require. All shower rooms are fitted with rain showers so you can enjoy water cascading down onto you like a rainfall, washing all the cobwebs of the day away.



Malaysia Airports promotes cooperation between airlines, airports and tourism organisations



In the last issue of Airlink, Malaysia Airports Managing Director Datuk Badlisham Ghazali said that tourism is the major source of mass-travel by air, and that there is a powerful trifecta synergy when airports, airlines and tourism organisations work together for the good of the ordinary airtraveller.

He explained that because of this, Malaysia Airports is increasingly working with local state and regional tourism organisations to collectively help airlines that are flying into or planning to fly into Malaysia. Since 2011, for example, Malaysia Airports worked with the Sarawak Tourism Board to secure the rights to host Routes Asia 2014 in Kuching; and to subsequently assist international airlines to commence flights into Malaysia's largest state. We have also worked on joint marketing with the Northern Corridor Economic Region (Koridor Utara), which encompasses 21 districts in northern Peninsular Malaysia in the states of Kedah, Perak, Perlis and Penang.

Malaysia Airports General Manager Airline Marketing Mohamed Sallauddin Haji Mat Sah was actively involved in all those previous programmes, and takes this opportunity to elaborate on some of the fresh

initiatives mentioned by Datuk Badlisham that Malaysia Airports is currently undertaking to promote tourism into Sabah and Langkawi such as the Sabah International Tourism Promotional Fund (SITPF), the Langkawi Charter Flight Incentive Programme (LCFIP), and the Langkawi Incentive Programme (LIP).

#### "The Sabah International Tourism

Promotional Fund was specially developed for Malaysia's most eastern state. It is a dedicated fund to support marketing activities and promotional campaigns to encourage travel into Sabah, and is applicable to all commercial passenger-airlines operating international scheduled flights or charter flights to Sabah. We also extend this fund to assist tour-operators who execute marketing campaigns that involve scheduled or charter flights into Sabah.

"Activities may take the form of advertising, promotions, exhibitions, familiarization-trips, brochures and trade-seminars, among others; but everything must be scrutinised by both Sabah Tourism Board and Malaysia Airports before being reimbursed. It is a joint-effort that is an excellent example of effective partnership that benefits everyone.

"We at Malaysia Airports have specially developed programmes for the legendary





island of Langkawi. For example, the Langkawi Incentive Programme assists airlines commencing operations into Langkawi International Airport. A Passenger-Growth Rebate applies to both existing and new airlines operating scheduled services into Langkawi, while a Landing Fee Waiver provides both new airlines and existing airlines operating new international routes into this scenic island destination with a year's free landing.

"The Langkawi Charter Flight Incentive Programme comprises two schemes which are productivity-driven and supportive in nature. The Passenger Reward Scheme rewards the lead-charterer who successfully brings passengers into Langkawi, while the Marketing Support Scheme provides a fund to assist the lead-charterer in promoting Langkawi as a tour destination. With this incentive, Malaysia Airports is helping to fulfill objectives and aspirations of organisations like the Langkawi Development Authority, the Kedah State Government and Tourism Malaysia.

As former international Chairman of the PATA Aviation Committee and current Vice-President of the PATA Malaysia Chapter, Mohamed Sallauddin is a strong supporter of the effective trifecta synergy when airports, airlines and tourism organisations work together, because he believes it is ultimately the ordinary air-traveller who benefits. "PATA set up the PATA Aviation Committee precisely

because of the symbiosis between the aviation and tourism industries", he explains.

"I am thoroughly convinced of the key role that airports play in the tourism-mix", he says. "People fly for various reasons. Business, studies, family visits, training-courses, special events...the list grows as air-travel becomes more commonplace. However, it is tourism that brings the vital volume in traffic – both for the airports and for the countries involved. In some ways, tourism is the life-blood of modern commercial aviation. # Painting the colours of emotion

afiee Ghani is known in the local fine arts industry for his lyrical abstract and contemporary paintings, notably his oil paintings. One can easily identify the Kedah native's artworks as his bold use of colours and strokes have made his style particularly distinctive and emotive. With such a unique approach to painting, it is no surprise that his artworks are sought after to be exhibited in prestigious galleries, with the most recent one being his Homeland exhibition, which explored the theme of human displacement. We sat down with Rafiee Ghani to learn more about the man responsible for such poignant paintings.

#### What prompted your interest in the arts?

In 1978, someone showed me a copy of the Dewan Budaya magazine which featured the works of Latiff Mohidin and Datuk Hoessein Enas, but the one I remember most clearly are the works of Datuk Sharifah Fatimah Syed Zubir. She had been travelling then, and she had several pictures posted in the magazine along with her artwork. At that time, I was still studying in the science stream, but the photos depicting her travels in Iran and her colourful paintings truly moved something within me. From that moment, I bought more Dewan Budaya magazines but did not think much of it.

Also, my father, who was a geologist, was travelling a lot back then, and he visited many museums, such as those in New York, Tokyo and Amsterdam. So, he used to send me a lot of postcards with pictures of museums and paintings, such as those by Van Gogh, Matisse and Seurat. After my MCE (Malaysian Certificate of Education) exam, I went backpacking around Europe, jumping from town to town. When I was in Holland, I went to a museum because my father had recommended me to visit one. The moment I saw the paintings by Van Gogh and other Impressionists, it rekindled my old interest which I had back in school. Immediately, I felt that I wanted to do something about it, I wanted to paint, I wanted to draw.

#### Clearly, Van Gogh and Matisse had a big influence on you back then and they still do until today, as evident in your artworks. Tell us a bit more about your artistic inspirations.

I believe that the first impression creates the most lasting impression. When I saw their artworks, all the bright orange, red and blues, all of it just hit me. To add to that, I remember seeing an exhibition by Srihadi, an Indonesian painter who had painted quite fluidly on the subject of seascapes. I felt as if his paintings were talking to me. They felt like poetry, and it was as if

you could sing a song with them. And I remember trying to copy these kinds of paintings. When I saw all the colours used by these artists, it just struck me, and now it has stuck to me too. Personally, I always speak with colours. I find them very important because they are a form of emotional expression.

You started your formal art training at De Vrije Acadamie, Netherlands, where you enrolled in a printmaking workshop and you pursued it further during your postgraduate at Manchester Metropolitan

# University. What intrigued you about printmaking?

When I was walking along the corridors of The Hague while on my way to the workshop, I noticed a series of prints, which although were small-sized, I found them to be very intimate. I remember a print of a girl, with braided hair looking at the ocean. Because I grew up in Kelantan, I always went to the beach and I could relate to this moment of being by the sea and just watching it. I thought the artist had captured that moment perfectly. I realised I wanted to create something like that too: something small and intimate but very deep.

When you started, your early works dealt a lot with still life, but your later exhibitions showcased more figurative works. For example, the 'A Dialogue'

works. For example, the 'A Dialogue' exhibition featured your own son. Tell us a bit more about this transition from non-figurative to figurative.


During our past recession, I lost a bit of the market for my work. So I travelled to Berlin, Germany for three weeks because I felt like I had hit a brick wall, whereby I was repeating the same thing. This had left me unhappy. I stopped painting and just focused on visiting museums, speaking to artists, and basically just unlearnt what I had known. I was impressed by an exhibition I saw there, so upon my return to Malaysia, I attempted figures for my following exhibition. With 'A Dialogue', there was nothing substantial about using my son, he just happened to be the only willing partner and participant! It allowed me to test my figurative skills, to create something new for the market and to explore if this was what I really wanted to do. However, after two years, I came to a conclusion that I wanted to do something else. So I started travelling again and eventually decided to paint about my travels instead.

# Yet you are known best for your mastery of oil paintings. Do you have a preference for this medium?

Yes, I do. What I like about working with oil is the way you can manipulate its texture. You can make it very thick, you can dilute it, you can smear it, or you can let it drip. Each painting has a personal touch to it and subsequently, there is an emotional attachment to each one.

Initially, when we learnt the traditional ways to paint, there were a lot of techniques and elements to consider even prior to painting the canvas. But over the years, I learnt the tricks to bypass certain elements and make it my own. Moreover, paint technology has gotten better, so now we have brighter, durable and flexible colours, which makes experimenting with oil more interesting.

I realise that many young artists live in a comfort zone. Undoubtedly, looking at the local arts scene here, I can see that a lot of these young artists are gifted and skillful. They can sell their work and be very successful, but doing art is not just about selling. It is about reinventing and recreating yourself. Unless you travel and get yourself exposed to the world outside, you will not be able to create something different. It will reach a stage whereby people will get bored, and they will start to question if you have anything new. It happened to me, and it has happened to many other artists too. But by travelling, you can get inspired and get a new spark for life. That is why I enjoy and treasure travelling so much. It is because it will always give me that rush when I get back home to do something new.

# What effect do you want your paintings to have on the person looking at them?

When you look at the painting, you should try to sense if it speaks to you, and if it does, question which aspect of the painting you like most. For my abstract pieces, people tend to tell me, "Oh. I do not understand modern art. I do not understand what you are trying to say." First and foremost, it is not about understanding it, it is about feeling it. For example, when you listen to any music, be it classical music or even rock, you may not necessarily understand the words or what is happening, but it still has an effect on you. The same applies to paintings. It simply has to trigger your emotions, your memory, and/or your imagination.



# What is your proudest moment as an artist?

I met this Italian man once. He was on a flight to Malaysia when he came across a feature on my paintings in the in-flight magazine. He decided that he wanted to find me, so upon landing, he rang up all the galleries to enquire if they sold any of my paintings. When I finally met him, he told me, "I collect art from all over the place, but I have not collected any from Malaysia. But, when I saw your painting featured in that magazine, I decided there and then that I wanted to collect it." So he bought a few and exhibited them in a library in Venice. It was a small collection, but it is still nice to know that my paintings were exhibited in a place like Venice.


# What can we expect from Rafiee Ghani in the future?

I want to keep experimenting, and in fact, I am going to Korea tomorrow, just to visit some new printmaking studios. I still have this idea that I want to resume printmaking.

Also, for the recent Homeland exhibition, I had diverged into figurative work. But now I am trying to sway away from that and instead attempt to incorporate more landscape elements. I realise that Malaysian artists need to try breaking through the international market, and that can only be achieved if we are constantly trying to do something which is newer, stronger and more universal. I want to keep pursuing that.

# RECORD-BREAKING AUCTION AT KLAS

L Lifestyle Art Space (KLAS)
witnessed yet another exceptional
auction during the KLAS Art
Auction Edition XXIV which was
conducted at its gallery in Jalan
Utara, Petaling Jaya on November 13,

This event marked its sixth and final auction of the 2016 calendar year. KLAS, which has been conducting auctions since September 2012, aims to encourage and stimulate a

market for modern and contemporary local art through its work as one of the leading auction houses in Malaysia.

A total of 56 out of 59 lots were sold during the 24th instalment of the auction, and the runaway winner would definitely be Awang Damit. An artwork from his most sought-after body of works entitled 'Essence of Culture "6/88" (1988), an acrylic on canvas saw competitive bidding with an initial opening price of RM25,000 which ended up being

sold at a whopping RM92,430.40 (inclusive of buyers premium).

Another notable victor was Yusof Ghani, who had a total of six paintings from his most important and popular series, 'Siri Tari' being sold at prices beyond the estimated upper limit set by KLAS. In fact, a piece of 'Siri Tari-DRAWING/90' (1990) set a new Malaysian record for his paperwork series, when it was sold for RM33,816.

The momentum was followed by Redza Piyadasa's limited edition print of 'Malay Ladies' (1988) that fetched an unprecedented price of RM28,743.60, almost 14 times its opening price of RM2,000. Khalil Ibrahim retained his prowess amongst his collectors, having had his batik artwork, 'Abstract Pink Print' (2002) sell for RM27,052.80.

However, some pieces did fall short of expectations. The mixed media artwork by Drew Harris entitled 'Evoke Series #5' (2013) was sold at its opening price of RM2,000.

The visible tapering interest for artworks by Datuk Tajuddin Ismail was noted by CEO of KLAS, Datuk Gary Thanasan, who acted as auctioneer. He commented, "Datuk Tajuddin Ismail also saw his prices fall a little again in the last four consecutive auctions."

This was in response to 'Rentak Alam' (2007) by Tajuddin being hammered for RM28,000, which saw the consignor losing over RM10,000 as he had acquired the artwork a year before for RM38,000.

The auction finally drew to a close after garnering sales of over RM600,000 within the span of three hours. KLAS is now in the midst of organising the next auction scheduled for late January 2017.


Athletify is a way to stay healthy and to keep moving wherever you are, just by connecting with the right people!

Its interior is minimalistic yet edgy, projecting an ever welcoming arm to its patrons. More often that not, what defines an establishment, as great as it may be, are the people who run it. The staff at V E Hotel are friendly, accommodating and attentive, making you feel like the most important person in the world, which in our books, is the make of excellent hospitality.

This establishment offers a selection of inhouse restaurants such as the Straits Estate,

which offers room service, the Veranda bar and lounge for you to enjoy a nip or two or to celebrate the joyous season, Kiosk the Deli for the grab-and-go crowd, and the Poolside Café for a bite after a workout. If that's not adequate, conveniently located opposite V E Hotel is Nexus Bangsar, where patrons are spoilt for choice with the variety of restaurants available such as Edo Ichi, Nexo restaurant and bar, Beyond Veggie by Secret Recipe and SOULed Out.

We were fortunate to be able to enjoy a tranquil sojourn in a deluxe suite room that was very hard to leave. Upon entering the



We drove up to the renowed Batu Ferringhi Beach to a beach haven that covers 30 acres of lush gardens nestled between the sea and Penang's emerald green hills. The unique name comes from a popular local folk song, Rasa Sayang which means "feeling of love" in Malay. I found myself humming the tune while checking in after having a warm reception at the Rasa Wing lobby.

We were escorted through the halls to our room and couldn't help but notice the tasteful blend of contemporary chic and traditional art that represent the opulence and elegance of the resort. As we entered the Rasa Premier Room, a mark of unmistakenable poise hanged in the air, our tired bodies taking well to the spacious room with high ceiling and soothing colour palette, and strategically placed plush sofa chairs to rest our feet. Once we got passed the Ohh's and Ahh's from the first look, our curiousity made us push the door with an enchanting dragon door handle that led to the chic marble bathroom with two sinks. The attention to detail in the bathroom was quite incredible from Loccitane bath products to the rain shower that comes with a theraputic massage shower with adjustable angles. I had to will myself out of there because it was by far the best shower ever. The large balcony fitted an enormous bubble bath tub and day bed. Apparently, you can get the concierge to prepare a bubble bath for a small fee with different scents that you can choose from topped with rose petals. Before you put on your bikini or birthday suit, do make sure to lower the blinds that can be easily controlled electronically. Personally, I would recommend enjoying the bubble bath while nibbling on the complimentary tid bits and beverages that are offered for the first-night stay, during sunset. Room service was impeccable. Not only was the fruit basket and bath amenities replenished but even our personal effects in the bathroom were meticulously arranged on a crisp white linen cloth.

There is no finer way to wake up than to the sound of the calm waves blanketing the sand and cheeps from birds outside the balcony as though it was an elaborate greeting by nature. It was the perfect setting to pick up a book and lie on the day bed just before breakfast. One of the many privileges of staying in the Rasa Wing is the choice between having breakfast at the award-winning Feringgi Grill at the Rasa Wing or the exotic Spice Garden Cafe at the Garden Wing. To enter the Feringgi Grill is to enter into a room of gastromic elegance from service, ambience to the food. We ordered from an ala carte menu that carried a well thought out variety accompanied by a buffet which consisted of pastries, fruits, cheese, cereals and more. We enjoyed each bite while admiring the panoramic view of the grounds and gardens of the resort. On the other hand, at the Spice Garden, we enjoyed a massive spread of authentic cuisines. Be it Chinese, Indian, Nyonya-Baba (Straits born Chinese), Japanese, Thai or Western, taste it all under one roof. Here, we could choose between eating in the air-conditioned dining hall where you can view a magical presentation of asian and western cuisines or eat outside under the canopy of giant rain trees with the sea breeze caressing your skin.

After a glorious meal, we took a brisk walk through the resort's garden landscape that truly embodies the oasis concept. Hammocks are placed strategically under the trees with nearby counters that carry several books you can borrow to read closer to the sea. You even have the option of getting a foot or shoulder massage by certified masseuses. Our stay in Shangri La's Rasa Sayang was nothing less than a head-to-toe, inside-out rejuvenating experience. ## A look into the recent revamp of the Royal Langkawi Yacht Club

Since the beautiful renovation has been successfully completed at RLYC, how do you differentiate the disciplines of running three distinctive departments ie: Yacht Club and marina, hospitality and hotel, and last but not least the new retail outlets?

The disciplines are not really that much apart from each other as they all aim to give our patrons the maximum satisfaction and make them happy. Yacht Club and Marina are well established and with the addition of the Langkawi Yacht Club Hotel and

Fishermans Wharf Langkawi, we have elevated our operations to a new level. Often the different disciplines are overlapping as a Yacht owner may stay in our hotel for a few days and also enjoy the new facilities on Fisherman's Wharf.

Is managing the Yacht Club easier because it has been operating for several years or more challenging because of the massive expansion?

grown into being the premier Regatta in the region and certainly plays a big role in promoting sailing and also promotes Langkawi and RLYC as a premier nautical holiday destination. It has a wide media coverage worldwide and as such is an important event for RLYC.

# What are the qualities of a good staff? Is staffing a challenge in Langkawi?

Good staff for me must be honest, selfmotivated and take responsibility for his/ her work and be a good team player as an operation like we have now requires an effective team effort for various tasks. Indeed, getting good qualified staff in Langkawi is an issue as the local population is less than 100, 000 and with more than 4 million tourist arrivals, almost everybody on the island is somehow involved in the hospitality industry. Our employee's motto is "We are gentle people serving gentle people", therefore the people who work for RLYC are our most valued resource. If we serve our people with trust, honesty, respect, integrity and committment we will nurture the right value in each of our staff which in return will also make them care equally about the guest of RLYC.

#### Do you feel it's important for the Royal Langkawi Yacht Club to expand beyond a marina with boats?

It is very important, that is exactly why we have had our massive redevelopment and have now, besides our award winning marina which now offers 250 berths for yachts of which six are for super yachts up to 80m, also a Yacht Club Hotel as well as Fisherman's Wharf. Fisherman's Wharf will be a new tourist destination on the island featuring a variety of shops and new dining options and will also have offices of many of the Charter companies in Langkawi. This way RLYC will not only appeal to a relative small number of sailors and yacht owners but to all tourist visiting the island.

# Is the expansion in step with what's happening in Langkawi now?

Yes, indeed it is in line with the plan to further promote Langkawi for nautical tourism and in particular the area where RLYC is located. Right next to us there are several luxury hotels with more in the planning to promote and turn this area into a new small "Monaco" of the East to bring more high spending tourist onto the island.

Getting around in Kuala Lumpur is easy. The transit systems are efficient, taxis are plenty and buses are cheap. The public transportation usage peak hours are from 7am to 9am and 4.30pm to 6.30pm during the working days.

## By Transit systems

The KL monorail and LRT coaches are air-conditioned and comfortable and run from 6am to midnight. The systems are connected to each other at several points and the network covers most parts of the city. Fares range from RM0.70 to RM2.80 per single journey.



Taxis are easily available at hotels or at taxi stands. Fares start at RM3 for the first kilometre and RM0.10 for every 115 metres thereon. There is a 50% surcharge on the metered fare from midnight to 6am and a baggage charge of RM1 per piece stored in the boot. There is also an additional RM1 for 3rd passenger (maximum 4 in a car). For an extra charge of RM2, you can book a taxi by phone.



Ecovans can accommodate up to 5 passengers. They serve mainly guests at major hotels and follow the fare structure of taxis but charge RM4 instead of RM2 for the first kilometre.



Buses serve all parts of Kuala Lumpur with fares beginning from RM1. Some hotels also offer free bus shuttle services to major shopping malls in the city.

#### Getting to the Airport

KLIA Ekspres: The journey takes about 30 minutes from KL Sentral and the fare is RM35 per person per way. There is also check-in facility at KL Sentral for some airlines.

Taxi: The fare from the city centre to the airport is RM60 - RM90 per taxi.

Eco Transit: Eco Transit can accommodate up to 5 adults and has a fixed fare of RM130/ trip.



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
