COVER STORY





"Hello! Is it me you're looking for?" is undoubtedly a familiar classic line where the song has become a household playlist throughout the world ever since its release in 1984 until today. Its memorable quality has made its singer a musical icon and an international superstar with over 100 million albums sold globally. An Oscar, Golden Globe, five Grammy, 16 American Music Award and five People's Choice awards, a World Music Lifetime Achievement Award and many more have earned him a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame. He is the lyrical legend, Lionel Richie.

His beginnings

Richie had a very humble beginning and his life story is a great example of the ultimate American dream. Born in the city of Tuskegee, Alabama, he lived in a small community with his family. His grandmother was a classical pianist, his father a military man, his mother an English teacher and his sister is now an educator. In his college days, Richie was very active in tennis. He was discovered by a group called The Mystics when he was in his tennis outfit and carrying a saxophone while walking across campus. Accepting the invitation to join The Mystics as their saxophonist and pianist, the band was later renamed, The Commodores.

The rise of The Commodores

The group also consisted of lead vocalist and drummer Walter Orange, lead guitarist Thomas McClary, bassist and trumpeter Ronal La Pread, Milan Williams as keyboardist, trombonist and rhythm guitarist, and William King as trumpeter, rhythm guitarist and synthesizer player. Despite his parents' objections, in 1968, he left Tuskegee to travel and perform with the group in the hope of becoming a huge success.

The Commodores were gradually reaching stardom and the group began to have a devoted fan base as they performed all over the country. Skip Miller, the vice-president of Motown Records, entered a club where The Commodores were performing and realised that the group had tremendous talent. Their phenomenal stage presence easily attracted the audience. The band was then presented to Berry Gordy and they immediately signed a record deal. This was the pivotal point of their musical career. They were under one of the most prolific record labels of the era and were signed alongside top R&B and soul acts such as Stevie Wonder, The Supremes and The Jackson 5.

The band began to prosper internationally when they performed as the opening act for The Jackson 5. In 1974, The Commodores

released their first single, Machine Gun, reaching number seven on the US R&B charts, followed by more hit singles such as Brick House and Just To Be Close To You. One day when Richie discovered that Marvin Gaye, one of the most creative songwriters at the time, could not read and write music, it inspired him to venture into songwriting. Hence, his lyrical ability in The Commodores produced Three Times a Lady, Stuck on You, Lady, Still and Easy.



Solo stardom

With his songwriting, singing, piano and saxophone playing abilities, Richie decided to pursue a solo career in 1981. The multitalented artiste then became one of the most successful performers in the 80's, with continuous top ten hits between 1981 and 1987. His first solo single, Endless Love, a duet with Diana Ross, was a wondrous hit. It is an evergreen love ballad that is still played at weddings and love-related events or on television programmes after decades. Other song successes that followed included Truly, All Night Long, Hello and Say You (Say Me), resulting in his Oscar and Golden Globe win. Richie also co-wrote a song with the late Michael Jackson, We are the World, which has become a Live-aid anthem promoting global charity, peace and humanity.

Richie has retained a solid platform in the entertainment industry and until today, still has a massive relevance and impact on the ever changing world of music. He has generated a new breed of writers and producers such as Jermaine Dupri, Dallas Austin, Akon, Sean Garrett, Stargate, Tricky Dream and

Kuk, Ne-Yo, John Eubank and Bob Sinclar. This generation of writers and producers have produced hit singles and albums for renowned artistes such as Beyonce, Rihanna, Mariah Carey and Mary J. Blige.

On Sept 12 2006, Richie released his eighth album entitled, Coming Home. The song, I Call it Love, from the album became his biggest hit in the US after years of hiatus from the music scene. Six years later, Richie decided to return to his Tuskegee roots for his next project. He recreated his top hits and collaborated with various big country names such as Shania Twain, Kenny Rogers, Willie Nelson, Tim McGraw, Blake Shelton, Jason Aldean, Darius Rucker and Little Big Town. The album, Tuskegee, reached number one on the Billboard Top 200 list and earned him huge critical acclaim. In 2013, he inaugurated a global tour, All the Hits All Night Long, promising fans a two-hour performance of his best music throughout the decades of his involvement in the industry. Countries in Europe and Asia, Australia, the Middle East and North America will all be able to sing along with Richie to his

greatest hits. He is well celebrated wherever he performs. It is not just his music that people love, but his great rapport with his fans has touched the hearts of many and made him a music legacy.

t is confirmed! The multi-award winning Broadway production, Jersey Boys the Musical, is set to hit centre stage Malaysia's capital city this month. Loved by more than 18 million viewers and admirers globally, including top Hollywood celebrities such as Pierce Brosnan, Michelle Pfeiffer, Kevin Costner, Jack Nicholson, Nicole Kidman and Tom Hanks, this is one Broadway musical magic that should definitely not be missed. The 15th longestrunning Broadway production has garnered over 54 major awards such as the 2006 Grammy Award for Best Musical Show Album, 2009 Olivier Award for Best New Musical and the Best Musical Tony Awards.

Jersey Boys the Musical is based on a true story about Italian-Americans, Frankie Vallie and the Four Seasons, who went from singing at street corners in the housing projects of northern New Jersey to becoming America's biggest pop sensation in the 1960's. Out of pure talent, the Jersey Boys created their own unique sound and a euphonious harmony, which resulted in their fame to rise dramatically. The group sang on national television and their songs such as Sherry, Oh, What a Night, Bye Bye, Baby, Big Girls Don't Cry and many more reached the top of the charts and became worldwide hits.

Despite their street smarts and fuel of ambitious dreams that led them to their success, they still could not escape from poverty problems and mafia connections from their past. The musical theatre of the Jersey Boys is illustrated in a manner of four stories, each representing a season of their career, and each told by a different member of the group. Spring reflects their earliest beginnings, harmonising under a street lamp on a pleasant evening. Summer is the apex of their success, while autumn marks a pivotal point in which their success starts to take a toll on the group members' personal lives and marriages. Winter, however, portrays a time of solitude, sorrow and

reflection. The musical is not only energetic with lively musical numbers, but guarantees a theatrical momentum which appeals to the audience's emotions.

Jersey Boys the Musical is written by Academy Award-winner Marshall Brickman and Rick Elice with music by Bob Gaudio, and lyrics by Bob Crewe. It is directed by two-time Tony Award winner, Des McAnuff and choreographed by Sergio Trujillo with music direction, vocal arrangements and incidental music by Ron Melrose. Atilia released her first single Pelangi Mimpi in 1996. Then she went on with her first album Sangkar in 2006 and released her second album Indah in 2010. Since then, she has blossomed into a dignified artiste, sharing the stage with some of the most renowned international artistes such as Incognito, Incubus, John Legend and more. Her other reputable works also involved acting in the memorable theatre production, P.Ramlee the Musical as lunaidah as well as the film, Kil (2013).

Behind all the hard work in her entertainment career, a good source of food consumption is crucial. When asked about her favourite place to eat, Atilia brought us to The Social at Publika in Solaris Dutamas, Kuala Lumpur. She was introduced to the restaurant by one of her friends when she attended a couple of events at the Black Box. The Social has various dishes of sharing platters, small eats, sandwiches and salads, pastas, classic westerns, oriental favourites and desserts which suit the local taste buds' love for both eastern and western cuisines.

One of Atilia's favourite dishes is the salted egg chicken strips. With the crisp of a bite and tender chicken inside, its yumminess is a great tease to your hungry appetite. She loves the Spaghetti Gamberoni which is pasta with prawns in roasted chilli and cream sauce. It is rich and velvety in texture with the spiciness from the chilli, a great addition to the taste. She confessed that she does not eat prawns, but she still loves the pasta. So she would still order it and share it with her friends. Other pasta dishes available include Lasagne Al Forno, Penne Pomodoro, Linguini Aglio Olio and while other western dishes offered are Very Beefy Burger, Shepherd's Pie, Chicken Schnitzel and more.

There is also a wide variety of oriental savouries at The Social. The all-time signature dish is the Aromatic Crispy Duck, served with homemade flat bread-like pancake, sweet plum sauce, chilli oil, julienne of spring onions and cucumber. The Ayam Perchik or Ikan Perchik is also highly recommended, especially if your palate is more traditional-oriented. Chicken leg or fish grilled with perchik spices and served with nasi ulam, salted egg, fish crackers and budu will surely get your mouth watering. If you like a local familiar and easy eating dish, the Char Bee Hoon with prawns, chicken and sauid served with belacan (spicy sauce) is also just as delectable. Other delicious eastern dishes include Nyonya Curry Laksa, Pad Thai, Nasi Goreng (fried rice) and Char Kway Teow.

Atilia finds it convenient that The Social opens until 1.00am, which is suitable with her time schedule. She said, "It is great that it opens until late because usually my yoga finishes about 9.30 or 10.00pm. So after that, I have about three hours to just eat whatever I want here. Plus they have great food and the people here are really friendly as they know you by your name when you come often."



he food at most of the eateries in Jalan Alor, one of thefederal capital's famous tourist spots are considered overrated and overpriced. However, there are a couple of restaurants or food stalls where people, including locals, would be more than willing to brace the traffic and the hassle in securing a parking space just for the sake of indulging in the delightful dishes served by those eateries.

Restoran Muar, located at Tengkat Tong Shin is one of the hidden gems in Kuala Lumpur that is loved by many including tourists. It is not the type of restaurant where you will find fancy interior design and decoration, in fact, the whole restaurant is a redolent of someone's a crunchy plate of vegetable. This dish is dining room when they are not expecting any guests. Most people, however, are captivated by the home-cooked food served that brings along a piece of home.

While their menu consists of a selection of home-cooked dishes, do not be fool by the look of it as they have one of the best fried egg in town! Their Crispy Fried Egg certainly live up to it's name - the egg whites blend perfectly with the hot oil that creates crispy and mostly crunchy egg white fluff. This is done without overcooking the egg yolk, and yes, you can still expect to see oozing golden yolk. Aromatic dark soy topped the fried egg, balancing the greasiness while adding a slight sweetness to

not to be missed, especially by those who love spicy food. The sambal used in preparing the two dishes is made to perfection, as you can taste the tang of fresh chillies along with a trail of sourness that makes the dishes appetising and savourous. The fresh prawns, squid, petai and fish used further enhance the flavour and texture. As it is aromatic at the same time, we can't think of any other perfect dish that would go well with the rice!

Its Petai Squid & Prawn and Thai-Style Fish are

We love how Restoran Muar cooks its Butter Kailan as well – it is fried after the kailan is chopped into small pieces, resulting in absolutely vegetarian as what seems like minced meat in this dish is actually fried skimmed milk and butter. The Butter Kailan, for one, is definitely not one of your usual dishes that is easy to come by nowadays and boy, we sure are delighted to find it here at Restoran Muar.

The saying that "food can never goes wrong with salted egg" is a little inaccurate in a way. Differentiating your dish from the rest can be a daunting task as it requires skills to make an extraordinary palatable dish. The Salted Egg Chicken is splendid - the tender and juicy chicken meat is well marinated with a generous amount of salted egg and the chef







certainly has good control of the fire while frying the meat. With one bite, the egg yolk overflows the meat texture, leaving a lingering scent of salted egg yolk as well as a slight saltiness in the mouth.

Do not underestimate its Otak-Otak either. Despite it's plain appearance, it has a smooth texture and rich flavour which is further enhanced by the sambal that tops the dish. The steamed Otak-Otak certainly brings out the smack of the fresh seafood and it literally melts in your mouth.

Above all, cendol is served here at only RM1.00 per serving. The bowl of cendol consisting of gula Melaka, red beans and chewy yet soft cendol mixed with ice is a temptation that we can't resist.

Restoran Muar also serves set meals from RM6.90 onwards per pax. It is very affordable considering the quality of food you will be getting as such food often costs a bomb in Kuala Lumpur. What's more, it is a pork-free restaurant. There is certainly no reason why this place is not in your To-Eat-Place list now.



If you are looking for food of great quality as well as affordable that is different from others, the one place that seems to be the talk of the town is the Holy Smoke Café. Owned by Edward Ninam Shah who started the eatery in memory of his late father, Datuk Kadar Shah, the café caters to the locals' taste buds and has recently gained wide media attention due to its one-of-a-kind dining concept.

One of the most unforgettable appetisers is the Nacho Libre (chicken or beef). Served in a large portion that can be shared with friends or family, the nachos were perfectly crisp in every bite. Forget about using fork and spoon, dig in with your hands and use the nachos to scoop out the oozy cheese sauce along with its Bolognese sauce, jalapeno and sour cream on top. The best part of this appetiser is that it is generous with its rich cheese sauce. There is not one nacho that will be left cheese-less. The Bolognese sauce provides a little saltiness, the jalapeno gives a little soury-spicy kick, while the light sour cream balances all the flavours. There are other great appetisers such as Mari-Mari Calamari, Piccolo Pizza, Great Balls of Fire and more.

One of the most popular choices in the main course menu is the Holy Smoke Burger. The first bite is heavenly. The sesame-freckled bun is soft and perfectly toasted. In between lies



a patty of ground beef so exquisite. The patty is definitely homemade because every bite is rich with meaty flavour and it easily falls apart, making it easy for you to eat. Its lettuce adds an extra crunch balanced with the softness of the tomato slice, while the caramelised onions swirling around your mouth provide a joyful sweetness. Your meal is complete with the serving of hot fries and a special sauce to match. There is also Steak Sandwich (sirloin) and Chicken Sandwich for you to choose from.

A unique dish at the Holy Smoke Café is the Spaghetti Meatballs. The way they make it is dry-style, which is different from those at other restaurants. The Bolognese sauce is infused into the homemade meatballs where all the flavours are compacted. The meatballs easily break into bits and pieces, so these evenly mix with the spaghetti. The meatballs are incredibly meaty and give a little sourish taste from the tomatoes. It is topped with sprinkles

of parmesan cheese and herbs, to give you a complete meal. Other dishes available include Salmon Penne Carbonara, Seafood Aglio Olio, Castro's Lasagne, Eddie's Fish and Chips and more.

For those with a more traditional liking, Holy Smoke Café also has a range of Asian dishes and one of its must-try is the Mee Bandung. Its fine mee (yellow noodle) is well cooked, yet the exterior is slippery and slips through your lips as you slurp it. Yum! Its ingredients infuse great flavours into the mee and you can taste the dried prawns, groundnuts and chilli. The spiciness occurs as an aftertaste and is not evident until you swallow the mee. The level of it, however, is mild and just right, so both spicy eaters and non-spicy eaters can enjoy it. Packed with tofu, prawns and pieces of meat and topped with fried onions, finely chopped scallions and red chilli, your plate will be cleaned out by the end of the meal. Other Asian choices include the Holy Smoke Fried Rice, Cantonese Kuay Teow, Curry Mee and more. For drinks, we highly recommend the vanilla milkshake. Smooth, creamy and silky, you will not be able to stop sipping. It is a beverage that will make you crave for more.

The décor of the café is set in diner style that radiates a funky retro feel with a slight modern touch that is explosive with colours. The floor is covered with black and white tiles and the walls are filled with vintage photographs. With props such as a motorbike, jukebox and a hanging go-cart, it sure gives you a dynamic atmosphere that reflects American culture. In terms of service, the staff are highly attentive and are particular about making their customers comfortable. The diner is even children-friendly as it provides colouring activities for kids. Simple presentation, delicious food and vibrant ambience, this is a friendly neighbourhood diner worth bringing your friends and entire family alona.









nnalakshmi is one of the most celebrated restaurants operating for the pass 25 years. Gaining major popularity for its Indian cuisine, this vegetarian restaurant was installed by the Temple of Fine Arts Malaysia, an organisation that serves as a sanctuary for the arts. It is a platform for talents to learn music and dance. As some of the talents had interest in cooking, Annalakshmi was established and the money collected goes to the fund in order to sustain and support the activities of the Temple of Fine Arts.

The restaurant serves high-quality, 100% vegetarian homemade recipes of north and south Indian cuisine. It provides you a choice of an ala carte menu or you can opt for its available buffet on the side. So grab a silver tray and its mini bowls and indulge!

As a starter, the staff suggested to scoop a handful of white basmati rice, pour a little bit of melted ghee, sprinkle crushed dried beans on top, mix it well together and take a bite. Yummy! The ghee provides a soft texture and somewhat buttery taste while the crushed dried beans give natural saltiness. This recipe is simple, yet delicious. Eat it with your hand and you will surely enjoy it more.

The buffet includes two types of rice, plain basmati rice and pulav. For basmati rice, you can eat it with resam, an Indian lentil soup that will get your mouth watering due to its zesty and mild spicy taste. However, if you prefer something richer, the sambar would be your better choice. Even though the zestiness is similar to resam, it is more filling as it is stewed with scrumptious potatoes.

The pulav, on the other hand, is basmati rice cooked with ghee, cottage cheese, corn and exotic Indian spices. Although it can be eaten on its own as it is already abundant with taste, it can also be paired with a variety of side dishes. For instance, you can accompany the dish with angled luffa rasdar, a gravy dish cooked with angled luffa, tomatoes and spices. To add protein to your meal, the mealmaker kulambu is a dish of clumped soy beans cooked in curry. Other accompaniments dish that you can enjoy from the buffet include mixed vegetable stew, green gram dhal, snake gourd aita, pickled mango, fried dried chilli, coconut chutney and vadai.

It would not be Indian food without a range of fresh made-to-order breads. One of the most preferred is of course, the chapati. Made with whole wheat flour which results in a firm texture, this Indian flat bread is healthy and delicious. Another must-try bread is the tomato puri. Crunchy on the outside and fluffy on the inside, it is best eaten while it is hot. Other fresh breads available include paratha, naan, dosa and oothappam, which can all be eaten with a variety of side dishes available from the buffet or the ala carte menu.

The restaurant is spacious and clean. As you enter through the traditional carved wooden door, you will notice the beautiful space is filled with simple square tables and chairs, and adorned with decorations that reflect Indian culture. The entire room is illuminated by colourful chandeliers that give a warm ambience. Its service is friendly and attentive. The staffing is unique because every day there's a different person who comes to manage the restaurant while most of the waiters and staff are volunteers including mothers and grandmothers. They come to work in traditional Indian outifts to represent the elegance of Indian culture as well as to provide a homely dining experience.







Be sure not to miss their Sweet Potato Leafs with Sambal Keluak as well. As bizarre as it sounds, this dish is in fact refreshing. The bland and yet rich buah keluak brings out the best of the crunchy sweet potato leaves with a hint of saltiness and the fragrance revitalising your taste buds at the same time.

We certainly find the heart of Malacca in The Tranquerah – the one place that offers us a short trip back to the olden days. Without a doubt, it has a splendid ambience and mouthwatering dishes. However, if you were to learn the origin of Peranakan, you'll realise that palatable Peranakan cuisine requires more than recipes as it involves patience, dedication and above all, a deep love for their Peranakan roots.

he saying "Oldies but Goldies" certainly best fit The Tranquerah – given the establishment's background and the cuisine served here.

To begin with, the restaurant's name, The Tranquerah was derived from part of Malacca city, Tranquerah Road, or currently known as Jalan Tengkera, where the owner's family resides for generations. Originating from a Portuguese word, Tranquerah which means palisades, entrenchments or outwords made from stakes into the ground was chosen in line with this pure Peranakan family's quest to cherish and preserve Peranakan history, legacy and traditions.

As we stepped into the restaurant, we were greeted with the sight of old wooden doors and window panes, wooden mould, rustic chairs, old batik printing moulds melded to the wall as well as knick knacks from the olden days such as F&N bottles as well as biscuits with colour tong. The decoration evokes nostalgia of the good old time.

The Tranquerah not only charmed us with its decor, it captured our taste buds with its selection of authentic Nyonya cuisine as well.

Its Udang Masak Lemak Nenas and Gerang Asam Fish certainly pleased our taste buds with their delicate texture and rich flavour. The combination of fresh prawns and pineapple with a tingling of spiciness of the Udang Masak Lemak Nenas leaves a trail of tender sweetness in the mouth. The Gerang Asam Fish, on the other hand, is very savoury. STREET FOOD HUNT

Jalan Masjid

Just off Persiaran Bandar Utama as you turn left after the Petron petrol station, you will reach Jalan Masjid and notice many stalls and other eateries by the roadside. The street come alive at the break of dawn. This is the road where you will discover food that are not only affordable, but delicious.

As you drive straight along Jalan Masjid and pass the Pelangi Utama condominium and the shop lots right before the exclusive Se Terra boutique homes, you will discover two hawker stalls on the left side of the road sharing one space in between where it is packed with people. It makes you wonder why a place as simple as this is visited by many.

Bakso RM5.00

The first stall on the left side serves Indonesian-style delicacies. It is uncommon to find bakso in Kuala Lumpur at roadside stalls. Well, now you know where you can get a nice hot bowl of bakso since this stall offers one of the most popular street food of Indonesia. Made from minced beef mixed with flour, the meatballs are served in a bowl of beef broth with yellow noodles and bihun (rice vermicelli). The concoction is then topped with beansprouts, spring onions and shredded cabbage.

Usually the broth of bakso is transparent. However, the bakso here is slightly reddish. An extra spicy and sweet-like seasoning or sauce is added to the bakso, providing a mild sweetness to the dish to suit the local taste. The meatballs are served in a generous amount. The yellow noodles and bihun also served in the broth are fine and soft, making them so easy to slurp. This makes a great late night supper. A bowl only costs RM5.00. Besides bakso, the stall also serves lontong.



Sate Kambing (Lamb Satay) RM0.80/skew

Although the stall serving the bakso is nameless, but they call themselves Sate Buleha. When asked of the most wanted dish by patrons, the sate kambing or lamb satay is actually the most popular. The lamb is diced proportionately and is then skewed the traditional way, on a stick, and grilled over a charcoal fire. It is served with homemade peanut sauce and soy sauce mixed with chopped onions and bird's eye chilli.

Unlike most satay, which are stiff in texture and overly sweet, this satay is seasoned in a manner which brings out the juicy flavour of the lamb so you can taste the lamb itself. Just one bite and you will be totally hooked! What makes it even more special is that its peanut sauce has a fine consistency, yet still rich as the perfect dip. There is no room for any crunchy peanuts to disrupt your chewing while you are enjoying your meat. You can also dip it into the soy sauce to add more vibrant flavours due to the onions and chillies. The sate kambing is a must-try because it is really good! Feel free to order and eat to your heart's content as this sate kambing is only RMO.80 per stick! There are other types of satay available such as chicken and beef.



Sharing the same space with Sate Buleha at the other end is a stall that serves beverages and Malay street food. However, there is one item on the counter that is distinct from others. The drink is called Teh Botol or bottled tea.

Teh Botol is a well-known Indonesian beverage sold throughout the world and produced by Sosro. The tea is served in a curvy glass bottle and is usually taken with ice. It tastes of the aromatic jasmine tea, soothes your throat and cleanses your palate. This seems to be a popular choice amongst visitors, so be sure to try the Teh Bottle, costing only RM2.50!





Maggi Mee Goreng

Beside the beverage station, you will notice one lady cooking. it is impressive how she manages to cook for many people at such incredible speed. It is not just that she is fast in getting food out of her wok, her hands create delicious food. One of the most highly recommended is the Maggi mee goreng (fried Maggi noodles) served with emping belinjo (bitter crackers) and lime on the side.

Maggi mee is an instant noodle brand which has now become a common local favourite. The Maggi noodles are first softened in hot water and then a sachet of flavouring is added to it. Since "goreng" implies that it is stir-fried, the chef also adds other ingredients for a more enjoyable dish.

Even though the Maggi mee goreng is cooked dry-style, it is still tasty. All the seasonings imbued well into the noodles. The onions in the noodles add a slight sweetness. There are also little chopped meat for protein. For a sourish punch to the dish, squeeze the lime on top. Mildly spicy, it is great for non-spicy and spicy eaters. Eat it with emping belinjo, which is slightly bitter. The combination is different than most Maggi mee goreng out there but it is still delicious. This generous serving of magi mee goreng is only RM4.00. There are other fried items available including fried rice.

Inspire by nature

Born in 1949 in Negeri Sembilan, Tajuddin had a deep-rooted passion for art at an early age. He not only possesses great talent, but he also has a solid educational foundation in art as well. He studied Fine Art at the MARA University Institute of Technology (UiTM) in Malaysia and then pursued Graphic Design at the Art Center College of Design in Los Angeles, USA. Then he did his post-graduate studies in Interior Architecture at Pratt Institute in New York, USA. In 1987, he was granted the Fulbright Research Fellowship by the American Council of Learned Societies of New York.

In 1975, Tajuddin became a senior lecturer and an associate professor of design at UiTM's Faculty of Architecture. In 2004, he resigned from UiTM and established an art gallery, TJ Fine Art, with

his wife, Khaliah Ismail. Both now are the managing directors of the gallery. It was set up for the purpose of exclusively featuring Tajuddin's works along with those of other chosen contemporary artists from Asia, the USA, South America and Europe.

Awards and achievements

The renowned artist has participated in more than 150 solo and group exhibitions in Malaysia and throughout countries in Asia, South America, Europe, and USA since the late 1960's. Active for almost five decades, Tajuddin has won numerous Art and Design awards nationally and his artworks can be found in private art collections, museums, exhibitions and corporations in Asia, the Middle East, Europe and America. He is also a well-respected graphic and interior design consultant to many government agencies and private organisations.

Some of his solo exhibitions held locally included Recent Paintings & Drawings at Dewan Tunku Chancellor (1977), Innerspace at Australian High Commission KL (1978), Recent Works (1979) and Unfold (1994) at Art Salon KL, and Mind Matter & Metaphor at Segaris Art Centre KL (2012). His works were also featured at the KL Auction in April 2013. He was conferred with various honours

and awards from Salon Malaysia of the National Art Gallery KL (Minor Award) in 1979, Malaysia Design Council (Minor Award) and Phillip Morris at the Malaysian Art Awards (Honourable Mention) in 1994.

His art style

Subjectivity in paintings is what makes abstracts so unique and beautiful. Tajuddin's abstract artworks are never straightforward and underlie a metaphoric or symbolic meaning. The interpretation of his paintings is never meant to be one way in particular, as he creates his art pieces in a way that can mean different things to different people as perception is based on life experiences. With art, it is not

a matter of understanding what an artist simply paints, it is more about how the art makes you feel. This principle has always been the sole purpose for the artist.

Nature is his prime inspiration due to his appreciation of God's creations as sustenance of life on earth, which he truly appreciates. The greatness of nature's wonder can make one ponder on its beauty and tranquill. Hence, Tajuddin's art uses a mixture of lines, colours and geometric shapes to portray the time and space of nature in a serene poetic visual language that is very well structured, yet lyrical. His complex sense of illustration with simplified oeuvre mirrors his artistic talent, knowledge, skills and spiritual development as an artist.

MULTHALIB MUSA

Sculpting to success

bdul Multhalib Musa is one of Malaysia's leading contemporary sculptors of our time. His unique works have grabbed the attention of the local visual arts community and earned him a solid platform in the art scene. The master craftsman is known for his "fluid metal sculptures" which have also garnered him worldwide recognition, numerous international awards and residencies. He is without a doubt one of the national's most prominent sculptors today.

Born in Penang in 1976, Multhalib received his first bachelor's degree in Design Studies from the University of Adelaide in Australia in 1998. He returned to Malaysia and pursued a bachelor's degree in Architecture from MARA University of Technology in 2000. His educational foundation in architecture has influenced his unique style in his abstract sculptural works.

Modern architecture not only involves the mastering of sculpture and art, but it also incorporates the use of technology. Multhalib's architectural educational background plays a great influence in his sculptural method. Before the commencement of any of his works, he conducts

a comprehensive analysis. He would start by creating patterns and visualising them technologically in three-dimensional forms, only then he would create small prototypes to ensure the right use of tools, materials and techniques before the production of the real sculptures. The fabrication of his works is often assisted by a team of builders through the use of machines to laser-cut steel. He would drench the steel with salt water to create a rusty effect, which is known as his sculpting signature and identity.

Multhalib fully utilises geometric shapes in his sculptures. He used mathematical shapes and equations of circles, spheres, ovals and swirls in the composition of his series of circular sculptures entitled, Swirls, showcased at the Australian High Commission Kuala Lumpur in 2005. He also did the same for his Involute series (2005) and Twist (2008). Over time, Multhalib developed a key principle that he holds on to until today, which is to transform a creation of two-dimensional into three-dimensional figures so that he would be able to resonate a connection between his sculptures and the audience.

Awards, residencies and commissions

Multhalib's sculpture demonstrates a clean-cut and edgy silhouette, distinguishing its kind from others. It is no wonder that his immaculate, kinetic-style has secured him many awards. In 2002, Multhalib won the Award of Excellence at the 6th Oita Asian Sculpture Open Competition in Japan and the Juror's Choice Award by the National Art Gallery in Kuala Lumpur. He was specially chosen to participate in the Ordos 11th Asia Arts Festival, Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region in China, and also the Urumqi International Urban Sculpture Symposium in Xinjiang, China in 2009. More impressively, he also won a competition to design an outdoor sculpture for the 2008 Beijing Olympics in China.

Some noteworthy residencies of his works include the Rimbun Dahan Residency in 2001 and the Australian High Commission Residency in 2004. He has also crafted some sculptures and received major commissions for public spaces such as Patience for Petronas, now displayed in the lobby of the Prince Court Medical Centre, The Essence of National Legacy for the Putrajaya International Convention Centre and the latest, Darussalam for the Grand Hyatt. Others include for the Westin, UMW Toyota, Aliya and Farouk Khan and more.

One of Multhalib's great works, the Malaysian Breeze is currently owned by the Hilton and is mounted on their double volume wall above the lounge. The Malaysian Breeze II, however, is set for auction at the KLAS Art Auction Edition VIII on April 6, 2014. The Malaysian Breeze II contains 21 pieces of distinct-shaped laser-cut metal sculptures, when combined and affixed on the wall, emit a unique kinetic ability to the overall visual. The purchase of this particular work of Multhalib includes a graphic illustration personally autographed by the artist himself.

Multhalib has shown growth in his series of sculptures throughout his years as a professional artist. He is evidently highly skilled in geometric knowledge, innovative concepts and sculptural precision which make him one of the leads in the contemporary Malaysian sculpture movement. Exhibiting consistently in group and solo shows since 2000, his urban-like rusty sculptural style marks him as a prodigious artist whose works are anticipated to be of utmost eminence.

BATIK PAINTING MUSEUM, PENANG

Spreading Malaysia's unique artistry

It was developed in various places worldwide. The Russians in Czarist times used batik method to produce spectacular Easter eggs while the Japanese used dye and wax resist to create beautifully-designed fabrics. However, the popularity of batik art originally rose from Java, Indonesia.


Batik art spread due to the trade relations between the Malay Kingdom in Jambi and the Javanese coastal cities in the 13th century. It was then that the Malay peninsula was influenced by the Javanese batik craft, technically and in its designs. In the 1920's, the Javanese introduced the use of wax and copper blocks to the east cost of Malaysia. Over time, the country developed its own identity of the batik concept, which now evolved and penetrated the art scene known as batik painting.

The growth of batik painting began with Datuk Chuah Thean Teng, an artist living in Penang, who was accustomed to the method of the old traditional batik technique of using the dye-resist process in making decorative motifs and designs on fabrics. In the 1950's, he had the innovative idea to combine his artistic talent with his batik-making skills to produce fine art that is distinct from others. Although it seems simple in theory, this fresh new idea of his took years of rigorous experimentation before he reached his ultimate success.

It was in Penang in 1955 that the first Batik Painting Exhibition was held, then in Singapore in 1956 and Kuala Lumpur in 1957. The exhibitions impressed those within the art sector and were positively acclaimed by the art industry. As several years passed, many Malaysian artists as well as those within the Southeast Asian region seized the challenge and embraced this new art method. This batik painting technique advanced at so many levels, which resulted in many luxuriant and varied styles of the artworks.

The Batik Painting Museum, Penang was established for the purpose of presenting the history of batik in Malaysia and its evolution through the emergence of various prominent artists throughout the years. The museum displays 70 batik paintings and is exhibited in chronological order, beginning from Chuah Thean Teng, the original creator of the batik painting technique, in the 1950's up until the current period. The Batik Painting Museum features over 25 artists such as Khalil Ibrahim, Datuk Tay Mo-Leong, Fatimah Chik, Toya, Koay Soo Kau, Cheong Soo Pieng and Seah Kim Joo etc. The batik medium has also been very well accepted by other regional countries, so the museum also introduces a few artists from China, Indonesia and Thailand.

Since its inception 60 years ago, Batik Painting has undoubtedly created its own platform in the art industry whereby artists are able to explore and advance their creative talents through the batik medium. Today, a vast number of Malaysian artists have fully devoted themselves to their careers in order to promote the beautiful art of batik painting that is gradually gaining attention and recognition. The Batik Painting Museum, Penang serves as an avenue to honour the local talents' contribution to the art industry and is a great venue for the public to appreciate our homegrown gifted artists. Most importantly, by creating innovative stunning visuals, delving into batik painting is a great way for our local artists to promote Malaysia and the beauty of its culture and heritage.







WWF-Malaysia's 'Islam, Wildlife Conservation and You' handbook to boost Muslims' environmental participation



"The handbook on Islam, Pemuliharaan Hidupan Liar & Anda", a joint initiative between the World Wide Fund for Nature Malaysia (WWF-Malaysia) and the Institute of Islamic Understanding Malaysia (IKIM), is now available online in English. It was published in Bahasa Malaysia in 2012.

Titled "Islam, Wildlife Conservation and You", it is the first handbook on environmental and wildlife consciousness and protection based on Islamic principles that is ever published in Malaysia.

The handbook aims to create a larger representation of the Muslim community in the protection and conservation of all existing forms of life with special focus on Malaysia's national icons, the tiger and marine turtle, both of which are endangered species.

"With Muslims comprising approximately 61%* of the current Malaysian population, the English edition of this publication hopes to encourage more individuals to understand their religious obligation in dealing with nature and for them to champion the conservation of the diverse wildlife we have in the country," said WWF-Malaysia's chairman, Prof. Emeritus Datuk Dr. Abdul Latiff Mohamad.

Since its launch in June 2012, the handbook has been used by the local communities in Kemaman, Terengganu for workshops on marine turtle conservation and has also been

shared with the Islamic religious authorities and departments in the Perak sub-districts, of Gerik and Pengkalan Hulu, as well as in Kelantan.

"We hope this handbook will guide the people to find solutions to the illegal wildlife trade and human-wildlife conflict through Islamic principles and ethics," Abdul Latiff said.

"We also hope that this handbook will reach a wider readership outside Malaysia as the Islamic environmental worldview is a holistic one with universal values that can stir action to safeguard our natural heritage – action that is now desperately needed more than ever," he added.

'Islam, Pemuliharaan Hidupan Liar & Anda" was produced after a memorandum of understanding was inked between WWF-Malaysia and IKIM in December 2011. Both organisations have since been working hand in hand to promote and enhance understanding and appreciation of the conservation of species according to Islamic beliefs.

WWF-Malaysia Calls for Public Support to Stop Wildlife Crime

WF-Malaysia congratulates the Department of Wildlife and National Parks Perhilitan on its recent success in arresting two men found with the carcasses of a leopard and a mouse deer near Karak, Pahang. These two animals were believed to have been poached from the nearby forest reserves.

Under the recently-passed Wildlife Conservation Act 2010 (WCA 2010), leopard and mouse deer are classified as totally protected species and protected species, respectively. Offences pertaining to totally protected species carry a mandatory jail term and a fine of up to RM500,000 if convicted.

The arrest is indicative of Perhilitan's determination to battle against the everincreasing illegal wildlife trade in Malaysia. Over the last six months, five leopards and one tiger were seized by the department. WWF-Malaysia hopes that this arrest will serve as a stern warning and a deterrent to all potential poachers and illegal wild life traders.

"Poaching and illegal wildlife trade have depressed the population densities of large mammals in Malaysia, substantially hampering conservation efforts to protect our precious biodiversity. Many of these magnificent large mammals, leopard and tiger included, serve important roles in maintaining the ecological equilibrium of our ecosystems, without which, our forests will be left impoverished," said WWF-Malaysia's executive director/CEO, Datuk Dr Dionysius Sharma.

Poaching and illegal wildlife trade in Malaysia are no longer a local problem as they involve more and more international syndicates operating with up-to-date technologies.



"We can only win the battle against these organised crime by stepping up our concerted efforts with the same magnitude and sophistication as the poachers themselves. In this respect, we will need more boots on the ground to conduct wildlife patrolling in our forest reserves and protected areas, to keep encroachment and poaching under control. Public support and enhanced coordination among various enforcement agencies are equally indispensable in dealing with wildlife crime,"Sharma said.

WWF-Malaysia pledges its continued support and commitment to enforcement agencies via strengthened collaboration and information sharing, to ensure that the law is used to its fullest extent in protecting Malaysia's precious wildlife.

It also calls for public support to refrain from buying and consuming wildlife products. "We firmly believe that joint initiatives by all concerned groups and the relevant authorities will greatly expedite much needed actions that will demonstrate Malaysia's seriousness about protecting its wildlife, "Sharma added.



Sirocco Secrets Dance with Sherlyn

Belly dancing for exotic beauty and sensual grace

riginating from the Middle East, the popularity of belly dancing has gone global. Although the styles differ from country to country, it has gradually evolved and fused with various other dance styles in different parts of the world. Egypt is considered the home of belly dancing.
