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SYED AHMAD JAMAL

Life as colourful as his paintings

The late Datuk Syed Ahmad Jamal treaded the path of art which led to a colourful adventure, a story told through his paintings which reverberate vibrant, energetic hues.

PRIMORDIAL DAYS

He was born to fit this artistic role. Born in Bandar Maharani, Muar, Johor on Sept 19, 1929, Syed Ahmad Jamal had a carefree childhood. Even at a very young age, he had a deep sense of observation and appreciation for the natural milieu of his environment. His family lived in a small community where rubber plantations were abundant. Evidence of his keen eye of observation, Syed Ahmad used to find himself gazing at the clouds and sky in fascination and speculated that perhaps God lay amongst those clouds. He was also an inquisitive and eagerto-learn young lad. He relished simple things in life like playing with his siblings while also spending a lot of time on his own, thinking.

It was much later when he realised that the early discoveries and awareness developed as a young boy sharpened his sense of sight and hearing, which played a pivotal role in his artistry. Syed Ahmad noted that he might not have cultivated the sensitivity to his surroundings had he stayed in Kuala Lumpur. An incident that jolted Syed Ahmad's young life was the death of his grandfather - his first encounter with the harsh reality of the impermanence of life. That black mark triggered a curiosity on the subject of life and death.

SCHOOLING DAYS

At the age of six, Syed Ahmad was enrolled into a Malay school, Sekolah Melayu Tambatan in Johor Bahru as it was the closest to home. At this school, he learned to write Jawi, an adapted Arabic alphabet for writing the Malay language, in his early days. His primordial days in school were made a challenge by his teacher who once gave him 12 lashes on his calf for not being able to read a sentence in Jawi.

Things took an ugly turn when Syed Ahmad's father, Syed Jamal reprimanded the teacher. As an act of revenge, the teacher failed Syed Ahmad in his Standard One examinations, which hindered him from progressing to the next standard. Nevertheless, it did not deter him from re-sitting and passing the examination six months later. On hindsight, this unpleasant experience motivated him to work hard and excel academically and be competitive in class.

After three years at the Malay school, he shifted to an English primary school at nine years old, where he was welcomed with books with coloured pictures which subsequently sparked a genuine interest in reading. This, he had proudly said, was the main reason he did exceptionally well in his studies and often achieved high scores in almost every subject.

It was during this time that he decided he wanted to become an artist. He related, "Every day after coming back from school and finishing my homework, I would start drawing. There was no single incident that sparked my interest to become an artist. I just felt that I wanted to draw every day and was very happy doing it." Apparently, Syed Ahmad projected his interest in art even before he started schooling, by sketching on the wooden walls of his house. His forbearing and empathetic parents not once scolded him for his mischievous deed, rather, bought him crayons and watercolours. His father was very encouraging. This flourished his interest in becoming an artist and it became a starting point for his adventure in art.

In 1941, during Syed Ahmad's school holidays, World War II broke out in Malaya. Whenever there was an attack, his family would hide in a special shelter. There was this incident where the house of an engineer was looted. Venturing to the site later, Syed Ahmad saw a lot of books scattered around the place.

Among all the books that were strewn about, he was drawn to one about art. Intrigued by it, he took it home with him and could not take his eyes off it. From the book, he read about famous artists such as Turner, Constable, Corot, Rosseti, etc and marvelled at their paintings. These artists, whose works he became accustomed with, became his inspiration.

After the war ended, Syed Ahmad's father's health took a toll for the worse and he eventually passed away in January, 1747. His family was provided with 75 dollars a month by the State Social Welfare Department. Syed Ahmad used the money for provisions which he had to carry all the way back from town. The arduous life, however, never broke his spirit, it was just part of life.

CROSSROADS BETWEEN ARCHITECTURE AND ART

As the eldest of his family, with six younger brothers and sisters to look after, a higher education seemed out of reach to Syed Ahmad. Despite his predicament, his achievement in school garnered the Yayasan Sultan Ibrahim Scholarship to study at the Birmingham School of Architecture, England in 1950. Naturally, he leapt at this opportunity. However, the induction of architecture made him realise that it wasn't his cup of tea. The only time he awaited eagerly for was when his class would head outdoors or to art galleries to sketch as he could whip out his favourite apparatus, his pencils.

Syed Ahmad's dexterity for drawing caught the eye of his principal, Mr Jones who acknowledged that his sketches were the best among all his classmates. His principal told him, "You are too good an artist to be an architect."

Intending to aid Syed Ahmad to trail his true calling, Mr Jones wrote to the Johor government and informed them that he should discontinue his studies in architecture and enrol in art school instead. The first letter Mr Jones sent was unfortunately rejected but he persisted and wrote an appeal letter which the Johor government responded favourably and Syed Ahmad was soon on his way to the Chelsea School of Art in London. Finally, his dream came true. "At that time, it felt like a dream. If it weren't for Mr Jones, I probably won't be an artist now," Syed Ahmad noted.

When he arrived at the Chelsea School of Art, Sved Ahmad had to work harder to catch up with his peers as classes had commenced. When he first decided to become an artist, he faced naysayers But efforts, coupled with his extraordinary talent, paid off. He did guestioning whether this path could be fruitful. But he paid no very well and soon won various competitions and awards. He heed to them as he wasn't in it for money. ART MAKETH THE MAN

Throughout his career, Syed Ahmad's artistic style had been through various changes. His landscape and (early) portrait paintings were stamped with his personal input and style, with traces of analytical Cubism and Abstract Expressionism, before his art matured into Symbolism.

During the roaring 1960's and 70's, his style leaned towards abstracts, while in the 2000s, his paintings became more spiritual. His Abstracts were marked sometimes by Jawi and later, Naskh calligraphic strokes and gestures (Naskh is a cursive Arabic script).

Syed Ahmad depicted the starting point of his life as an artist in Britain (Birmingham School of Architecture and Chelsea School of Art) through three notable works, all done in 1956, , namely 'Battersea Park I and II' and 'Duel in the Snow' (inspired by the epic battle between Hang Tuah and Hang Jebat on morality and justice).

It is evident that to him, it was the landscapes and happenings around him that gave him his 'topics'. In later years, he delved into socio-political issues, like anti-nuclearism, the environment, Palestine and Bosnia, in which he expressed his thoughts through Symbolism. Syed Ahmad's art resonated with the spirit of the age and marked historic events in the country. Despite his reputation then, Syed Ahmad Jamal remained a true artist, one who created art neither for recognition nor wealth, but merely as a form of self-expression.

of nipah palms standing in the soft mangrove mud like scaffolds against soil erosion, with their fern-like palms outstretched, glistening warrior-like in the sunlight. The nipah palms were common milieu during his commune between Johor Bahru and Batu Pahat High School, where he was teaching then.

"It was a milieu contrasting to that of the mild, mellowed, cultivated civilised landscape or garden countryside of England. The palms stood firmly, as they were enjoining the earth, space and the while the serrated blades of the palms shot up, as if in response to the invisible rays of the sun. The sheer bout of energy was catalytic, echoing and re-echoing again years later in the 'Gunung Ledang' and 'Between Heaven and Earth series'. In 1957, Syed Ahmad produced Mandi Laut.

"It ties up my academic knowledge and training in the West with the local tropical ambience. I transposed and transmuted the Western figurative format (a la the Madonna and the Rock) into a Malaysian setting. Besides, the act of posing (of the figures) is also a Western thing," he said.

Syed Ahmad's decorated belt of achievements included designing an emblem for the National Art Gallery of Malaysia. The stylised human eye in the emblem represents vision of the artist while the rectangular shape represents the visual arts. The long oval shape that circles the eye and the rectangular shape represents inner content.

NUR TENAGA

A special piece entitled, 'Nur Tenaga' is the final artwork produced by Syed Ahmad before he passed on in 2011. This painting is the highlight of KLAS's upcoming Art Auction Sale XXIX. Defined as light and energy, the late artist depicted these elements through his forte, colours. Nur Tenaga portrays a radiating energy of light at the focal point of the painting while surrounded by hues of green, blue and red.

The solo show in Croatia that made waves in Europe National laureate Datuk Syed Ahmad Jamal legacy lives on through his paintings. The prominent artist who passed away in 2011 at 81 years old, was celebrated this year with a posthumous exhibition at the Museum of Arts and Craft in Zagreb, Croatia from June 3 to 29. The show, aptly referred him as the 'Guru of Colour', the perfect representation of the artist.

Three prominent galleries in Malaysia, namely Galeri Petronas, Bank Negara Malaysia's Museum and Art Gallery and National Visual Arts Gallery played a part in the exhibition by loaning works by the artist. Nurlhaq, Syed Ahmad's son curated his father's works for the show which included, 'Ruang Qiblat', 'Sireh Pinang', 'Keris', 'Saturday Night', 'Self Portrait', 'Nuraini', 'Warna Merdeka', 'Basmallah' and 'Energy East'.



A TWO-MAN SHOW WITH LATIFF MOHIDIN

LIn an interview with KL Lifestyle in 2011 that touched on Pago-Pago, Syed Ahmad revealed that the '1963 Pago-Pago' was one of his most treasured possessions. He also elucidated that he took part in a two-man show with Latiff Mohidin at the Royal Selangor Club in 1967. In the exhibition, Syed Ahmad had sold almost all of his artworks while Latiff was not able to sell his works. As a result, at the end of the exhibition, Latiff gifted possibly the earliest Pago-Pago ever produced by him on canvas in 1963 to Syed Ahmad in lieu of cost of putting up the exhibition. The artwork was once enshrined in Syed Ahmad's living room amid his early masterpieces and is now in the private collection of KLAS's CEO, Datuk Gary Thanasan.

THE UNREAL DEAL EXHIBITION

Marking the 60th anniversary of Merdeka, 'The Unreal Deal: Six Decades of Malaysian Abstract Art' exhibition sheds light on the emergence and development of the Abstract genre in Malaysia over six decades. This exhibition emphasises the cultural legacy of prominent artists including the late Syed Ahmad Jamal. It showcases the masters' influence in shaping the local art scene, paving the way for Abstract artists of today. The Unreal Deal puts the spotlight back on a field that is at the heart of Malaysia's 60-year creative history. It is the nation's abstract artists who monopolise the aesthetic hall of fame. The exhibition is a meeting place of young and old, where every generation is represented on canvas.

Malaysia's leading exponents of the genre gathered at Bank Negara Malaysia's Museum and Art Gallery to provide what is probably the largest ever display of abstract art in the country. Half a century ago, artists such a Syed Ahmad Jamal, Ibrahim Hussein, Latiff Mohidin, Yeoh Jin Leng and Jolly Koh could never have imagined they would revolutionise the way art is seen in their homeland. They dragged a young nation into the modern world. The paintings in the exhibition show the continuity of abstraction.

The artists have rejected realism in favour of something that challenges viewers, if they want to be challenged. As the title of the exhibition suggests, the unreal can be as significant as anything else. The appearance of abstract art is removed from reality but it has substance. Six decades on, it also has longevity. "The Unreal Deal: Six Decades of Malaysian Abstract Art" Exhibition at Bank Negara Malaysia's Museum and Art Gallery is on from Aug 30, 2017 to Jan 21, 2018.

Our exploration of Gobo Upstairs' new menu kicked off with an interview with the man of the hour, Chef Mun, about his creations, he mentioned that the new menu was curated with careful consideration and he ensured that the flavours of the fare (from starter to dessert) amalgamate and complement each other seamlessly.

APPETIZER

Signature Salmon Crab Cake with Grilled Prawn

This dish was by far our favourite appetizer for its tender texture. When paired with homemade guacamole, truffle slices, saffron fumet miniature herbs and salad, it becomes a force to be reckoned with. This intricate offering takes three days to come together and boy, did it pay off in essence.

SOUP

Mushroom Tea Soup

It was the first time that we tried Mushroom Tea Soup. The tea was drizzled over the bowl of five variants of mushroom in it, topped off with a summer truffle oil. This soup is also known as the memory maker as its flavours make one reminisce about the good old days.

The Lobster Bisque is Chef Mun's proudest creation and we were not surprised why. Garnished with tarragon cream, the consistency of the Lobster Bisque was comm il faut. Hidden beneath the bisque were generous chunks of lobster, adding to the

Grilled Tomahawk 1500 gm This beast of a steak came on a massive platter and personally carved by Chef Mun. The Tomahawk teased us with its pink succulent meat urging us to get our hands on it. The chef boasted his skills in carving the steak and presented it beautifully, with a side of milky mashed potato and seasonal vegetables.

Duck Tamarind

The revelry continued with the perfectly seasoned Duck Tamarind and a side of grilled asparagus, figs, roasted cashews and spices. We realised that consuming the duck alone was pretty fantastic but when paired with the complimenting condiments, it was so tantalising that we needed a minute to truly appreciate its essence.

Baked Fillet Cod Marinated with Miso Honey

Heavenly wouldn't begin to explain what we felt about this cod fish. It pranced to our table on a colourful plate comprising wasabi. bean curd, and wilted romaine lettuce. Firstly, the meat of the cod fish was tender to touch,







secondly, we were surprised at how well the Japanese miso fused well with the baked fillet cod. Chef Mun made sure that the miso's strong piquancy was levelled out by the butter-infused honey. Needlessly to say, we were lulled into a pleasant coma after leaving the plate spotless.

A JAPANESE HAVEN AT Hana Yuzen

Authentic and artful

Adorned with wooden furniture, quaint Japanese curtains and a clean minimalistic tone, with private rooms available for events and gatherings, this pleasant nook of a restaurant imbues guests with a collected calm and quiet comfort. That is, until the food arrives. We were instantly floored by their gorgeous platter presentations. Intricately arranged dishes, thoughtfully ensembled, aimed to emulate authentic traditional Japanese cuisine.

Our meal began with the Yu Roll. Refreshing assortment of crisp vegetable leaves bundled up neatly around a morsel of sweet crab meat, the whole medley neatly swaddled in thinly sliced cucumber sheets. The tangle of sweet crab meat, slightly sour Japanese mayonnaise and the crunch of fresh greens proved truly satisfying.

We were then bestowed the Chicken Terivaki and Chicken Nanban mixed platter. Both were chicken dishes but they played out in exceedingly divergent forms. The Teriyaki was deep-fried to crisp perfection, the skin giving way to the teeth with a gratifying crunch while the flesh remained moist and tender. The Nanban, on the other hand, was chicken, minced to paste with morsels of meat embedded within, and the whole thing wrapped up in flour, fried to achieve ideal crusty levels. Biting into one will elicit involuntary moans of pleasure as your teeth pierce through the solid crust and sink into the juicy, tender filling within.

Next came the Hoba Yoniku Itame. A platter of grilled lamb with accompanying mushrooms and green peas. Glazed with shiso rice seasoning and hoba leaf shavings, the dish exuded a toasty aroma upon entry into the room. The lamb, soaked in savoury miso sauce, soft and succulent was a pleasure to indulge in, especially when accompanied with the faint bitter notes of Japanese tea.

We certainly saved the best for last. Our favourite dish here was the Hana Bloom. Decadently decorated as it was delicious, this creation was ambrosia in the mouth. Hana Bloom is a harmonious combination of three fresh fish sashimi. squid and Japanese prawn, all bathed in special homemade secret sauce. The hint of green apple zest from the clear sauce tangoed tantalisingly with the fresh nibbles of seafood, its essence permeating throughout your mouth as you pause to appreciate the profound symphony of contrasting flavours, merging to create a single exquisite finale.

Artful in design and uncomplicated in flavour, Hana Yuzen transported us to the land of the rising sun through its exquisite fare. A place definitely worthy of a visit.

The interior of this heritage building evokes a feeling of cosiness, of returning to one's home. We realised that old Malay songs from the 1950s and 60s melodically accompanied us while enjoying our meal, capturing the very essence of the Peranakan culture. One would encapsulate this joint as "a memorable dining experience unlike any other".

This restaurant is a passion project and a homage to their mother's legacy who is a Nyonya and responsible for the all the recipes in the menu. The one-year-old restaurant is affluent in offering its patrons a Baba Nyonya experience through food and their ambience. Melaka, being the epicentre of heritage and culture sees Nyonya Baba restaurants ubiquitously. That being said, Manis J Nyonya Restaurant differs from the myriad of Peranakan restaurants due to three basic principles the operators live by, to provide good customer service, serve the best Nyonya cuisine in town and finally, cleanliness.

Jennifer and Joyce's fervour for cooking and their brainchild (the restaurant) includes them getting their hands dirty in preparing



the Mise en Place at their central kitchen. You can tell that they love what they do when they attain satisfaction merely from the smiles of their customers' faces as they leave the restaurant and asserting that they will be back with their friends and family.

SAMBAL NENAS TIMUN

Yes, we were as dubious as you are right now reading this. To our pleasant surprise, the sambal did go well with the pineapple and cucumber. This Peranakan rendition of a salad is absolutely refreshing and apt as an appetizer. It is particularly interesting that only in the aftertaste you do taste the hint of spiciness from the sambal

AYAM BUAH KELUAK

This was a first for us. Jennifer and Joyce warned us beforehand that this dish is an acquired taste and for adventurers. Being the adventurers we are, we told them to bring it on! The buah Keluak is actually a fruit hailing from Indonesia. It is thoroughly

washed, soaked and a sliver is cut out before cooking. If it's your first-time trying this unique dish, the waiters will happily aid you in the proper way of consuming it. A tiny fork-like utensil is served with the dish, for you to ferret out the fruit. Its taste was unlike any other and seamlessly fused with that of the chicken and gravy.

IKAN CILI GARAM

The Ikan Cili Garam is said to be customers' favourite and after getting a taste of it, we understand why. This mother-load of fishes was fried to a crisp and topped with a homemade sambal that was just out of this world. Like a drug, the sambal was an addiction; we could not stop our hands from reaching out for more fish and sambal. What we loved about this dish was how contrasting it tasted from other sambal, especially the ones in Kuala Lumpur. P/S: Do yourself a favour by ordering this because you will not regret it.

LEMAK NENAS UDANG

you grew up loving the game of nide-and-seek, you're about to stumble across a lot of fun. Crime Cocktail Bar poses a real challenge to discover, albeit the fact that it is located right in the middle of the hustle and bustle of TREC. A real treat for the adventurous, this secret nook has an unusual charm, absent from most bars in KL.

Its speakeasy character, hoewever, deserves some highlight. With a décor influenced by the pre-prohibition era in the 1920's, Crime's inconspicuous entrance and absence of signage transports us back to the perilous past, when alcohol was a thing outlawed and speakeasies were multiplying to supply a much desired

demand. Consistent with elements from history, Crime's primary mode of sales come from cocktails, because during the Prohibition Era, it was easier to mask the flavour and look of a single glass of alcohol rather than a full bottle.

The unique, suave mood that permeates this dimly lit enclave washes over you once you actually find its secret doors. Hidden within Crave Restaurant, an oyster bar on TREC, this speakeasy exudes sophistication and flair.

Calm conversation can be made on lavish, comfortable leather cushions amid soothing jazz music. A place to put the mind at ease while enjoying the copious

amounts of captivating cocktail creations. Catering specifically for the Asian palate while borrowing elements from the Mediterranean and northern Europe, the drinks here are mild with the intent of educating guests on cocktail gustatory pleasures instead of knocking them out with strong liqueur. This den of experimentation takes the risky route on use of ingredients. You'll find exotic cocktail concoctions containing bizarre elements such as pork bacon, fish roe, peanut butter and squid ink.

We fell in love with Crime's Silk Road. A mellow, unassuming light mixture of whiskey, lime and honey, the flavour of which, comes to live when taken with its

accompanying strawberry and basil wrapped up neatly in a strip of pork bacon.

Another favourite of ours is the Crime Crimson. An amalgamation of familiar flavours that spark curiosity while imbuing peculiar pleasure. A frothy, creamy texture with a hint of citrus, the pleasant notes of coffee and pandan blend seamlessly, creating a concoction worthy of deliberate appreciation.

One noteworthy creation is the MCF Eggnog. Marrying Cognac and Cynar together with a whole egg, this play on taste and texture did not go unnoticed. The tango between the fruity notes of Cognac and Cynar's bitter ones creates a pleasant sensation on the tongue, encouraging sip after thoughtful sip.

A final deserving mention would be Crime's Cocaine, an enthralling shot of liquor mix that'll guarantee a quick rise in 'spirits'. A blend of vodka, absinth and overproof alcohol, plus a hint of cinnamon spice, the astonishing element of this shot is its imbibing procedure. The shot glass will firstly be lit ablaze, the flames quickly blown out and the whole shot sucked up instantly before deeply inhaling three lungfuls of mystery 'air'. Not only does Cocaine put on a fascinating show, it'll leave you with a slight buzz and an invigorating mood the rest of the night.

Crime Cocktail Bar is bent on creating a stimulating yet sophisticated cocktail space for guests to experiment and enjoy. A place where even smoking is discouraged, so as not to interfere with the aroma and taste of the exquisite cocktail blends. This truly is a place that'll thoroughly caress all five of the natural senses.

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Cebu Pacific in Expansion Mode



Cebu Pacific is the largest airline in the Philippines in terms of the number of passengers it carries annually. Within the Philippines, it has the highest flight frequencies and cover the most number of routes among the airlines.

Started operations as a low-cost carrier as recently as in 1996 and flying to mainly domestic destinations in the Philippines, it only received rights to operate international flights in the first decade of 2000s, with flights to several Asian countries as well as to Guam in the Pacific Ocean. Vietnam Airlines Strides Ahead with A350s

The narrative of Vietnam Airlines, becoming what it is today really began in February 1994, when the then US President, Bill Clinton lifted decades-old trade embargo to allow Vietnam Airlines the ability to acquire Western-built aircrafts. In April that year, it announced that it would phase out the inefficient Soviet planes for better Western ones.



The replacements were gradual, starting with the leasing of aircrafts, such as nine A320s from Air France in 1995. Its fleet in the 1990s comprised of a mix of aircraft types, including Soviet ones.

Its first acquisition was in 2001, when it acquired four Boeing 777-200ERs, which was delivered in 2003. It leased six other of the same aircraft type to be the flagships of the airline to serve medium and long-haul routes. On October 2007, the airline signed a memorandum of understanding for the purchase of ten Airbus A350-900 XVVBs and 20 additional Airbus A321 neo. The Airbus A350s were to supplement the Boeing 787s which it had earlier ordered. The single order of aircrafts resulted in Vietnam Airlines becoming one of the largest Airbus operators in Asia.

Vietnam Airlines started to operate flights from Vietnam to Malaysia since December 1990 with frequency of total 4 flights per week from Hanoi and Ho Chi Minh city and this number increased to 14 flights per week in 2017. The number of passengers on Hanoi and Ho Chi Minh City to Kuala Lumpur routes has experienced a remarkable growth of 96% and 48% respectively during 2010-2016 period and all flights are currenly operated by Airbus A321. Overall, Southeast Asia is one of Vietnam Airlines major markets which has continued to show an upward trend in demand modern aircraft in the world", said one of the for passenger air travel.

Vietnam Airlines received its first Airbus A350-900 XWB in July 2015, becoming the second operator of the type wordwide after Qatar Airways. In August 2015 the airline first Boeing 787-9 entered the fleet. With these

Can you tell us, current and future plans of Mitra Travel and **Pacific World Travel?**

Mitra Malaysia Sdn Bhd (Mitra Travel), founded in 1972 started as a GSA for Merpati Nusantara Airlines – and it expanded into a full-service travel agency in the late-1970s when we were able to become an IATA accredited travel agency. Today, Mitra Travel is on the forefront of travel agencies in Malaysia and the Global Alliance Partner of EGENCIA (Expedia 4 Group).

Pacific World Travel Sdn Bhd (PWT), established in the mid-1980s is a bridge between Malaysian travel agencies and airlines that wished to access Malaysian travellers by acting as General Sales Agents for those airlines. Our key principals included initially American Airlines and Philippine Airlines, among others (Philippine Airlines remains our client until today) and over time a number of other airlines as well as National Tourism Organisations (NTOs), cruise lines, car rental companies placed their **J** 4th largest economy by 2030. trust in us as their representative.

In the early 2000s, through APG Malaysia, we became the Malaysian Country Member of APG, a worldwide network of GSAs and companies providing distribution and financial services to airline clients. I am currently a Member of the Board of the APG Network as well as the Regional Vice President for Asia-Pacific region comprising 20 countries and territories.

Can you elaborate on your involvement with PATA?

I first attended a PATA event in Sydney, Australia in 1975. That conference had such a positive impact on me.

I was elected as President of PATA and presided at the PATA Annual Conference in Vancouver in 1990 just 15 years later, and be the first (and still the only) Malaysian to be elected as PATA President (the position has now been renamed as "Chairman").

Some years later, I was honoured with PATA Life Membership, and today there are 2 other Malaysian tourism professionals similarly honoured, Dato Abdullah Jonid and Dato Hj Azizan Noordin

tourism and travel industry in Malaysia for the next two vears?

Malaysia has a number of key strengths, namely as an attractive destination for tourists from around the region as well as long-haul tourists as well as a key market for overseas destinations as is evidenced by the huge popularity of consumer travel fairs such as the MATTA Fair. am also very passionate about travel and tourism in ASEAN. The "open skies" policy has today enabled airlines to create successful routes that link cities in ASEAN, not only capital cities but also secondary cities and resort destinations.

What is your personal philo-O sophy as an entrepreneur and business investor?

I believe that companies have to allow and enable the people in their companies to be creative and to assist ideas and innovations to be nurtured and developed.

I also subscribe to the notion as expounded by the famous English poet John Donne "No man is an island, entire of itself, every man is a piece of the continent, a part of the main"

What are your favourite pastimes and how do they influence or complement your **business activities?**

One of my passions is travelling, to see as much of the world as possible. Fortunately, this goes hand-in-hand with my business activities. However, my "bucket-list" is still a

long one but I hope to still continue to travel

My favourite places to visit are Hawaii, Venice and London.

O What are your personal goals O and plans for the future?

As I am the head of our overall family business group, I have the luxury of choosing to focus on two parts of The Melewar Group, namely the travel & tourism division as well as the education & training division, both of which I derive enormous satisfaction in being involved.

Who are your mentors in business?

Argentina's ambassador to Malaysia, Manuel Balaguer Salas has been fervent in advocating the intertwine of cultures between the two countries; one of his many efforts being the Che Malambo's esteemed appearance in KL. With an exclusive opportunity to pick his brain about Argentine-Malaysian affairs, here are some of his thoughts since he took office in April 2016.

What are some of the simple pleasures in Malaysia that you've uncovered since you took office?

Diversity, to me is a simple pleasure. To see people of vastly different ethnicities working together, living together, is something I truly cherish. Malaysia also has divine nature spots. I thoroughly enjoy it. Hiking, cycling, sometimes into the 'kampungs', I love the green that permeates this country.

What are some of the unique working etiquettes you've stumbled upon since you starting working here?

Malaysians are extremely polite and they deeply treasure relationships, up to a point where they eschew repudiation. "No" is a very strong statement, and might even be considered rude. So Malaysians go around it, softening statements and sugar-coating answers, in a surprisingly sophisticated manner. Argentines are more frank in nature and I had to get accustomed to this polite play of words. Don't get me wrong, it's not a negative characteristic I'm describing, just a different way of working.

What are some of the best accomplishments in Malaysia-Argentina relations throughout the years?

This year marks our 50 years of partnership. So much has happened. Investments from Malaysia include Petronas opening an office in Buenos Aires, Argentina, in Dec 2016. From Argentina's end, our flagship Argentine company IMPSA has a joint venture with Malaysia, becoming the only state-ofthe-art capital goods manufacturing company in South-East Asia, investing over US\$100 million over the past 10 years. Argentina's exports to Malaysia increased by 19 percent in 2016 and we recently translated two Argentine books into Malay. Even in sports, our polo and football players and coaches are getting deserved recognition from the Malaysian teams. We've come so far, and can only hope to go further, together.

What are the biggest growth opportunities in terms of trade and investment do you see between the two countries?

The Halal industry. Malaysia is striving to become a Halal hub. And Argentina is

one of the major food producers in the world. I see partnership opportunities to supply this growing demand that'll benefit both our nations.

As the official bridge between our two countries, what you would say to Argentines about Malaysia? And vice versa.

To Argentines: We can learn a lot from this wonderful country. Malaysia, grew extremely rapidly, changing from an agricultural-based economy to its more sophisticated industrialised form in the mere span of 40 years. Not many countries have done this and I admire how Malaysia did that so quickly. When you're here, be careful with the food, you might not be able to eat what you've ordered. Malaysians don't joke about their spice! Also, pay attention and respect the different cultures and religions present here.

To Malaysians: If you visit Argentina, please don't get offended with our sense of humour! It might shock you at first; our jokes may be invasive in nature. But don't worry, they contain no malicious intent. We have unbelievably beautiful landscapes too. Bariloche, Patagonia, and the Iguazú Falls. Oh, and bring your spices with you. We often only use salt and pepper for flavour there.

Bromley dipped his hands in many mediums and was finally led to the medium of paint which he subsequently fell in love with.

ARTWORK

Every production of this artist is an expression of his soul and for the past 20 years, Bromley's artworks have expressed just that. His works have reaped widespread acclaim and notoriety in Australia and internationally. He has exhibited in nearly every continent including Asia, Europe, Africa and America.

Bromley's artworks revolve around three distinct themes: the first, being nude female portraits, the second, his children's series, and third, his exploration of the world as we know it. His artworks portray his unique style of painting where he explores various mediums that result in whimsical fruition. Bromley's work is enduringly figurative, daringly coloured and executed with a graphic intention that is both striking and memorable.

NUDE PORTRAITS

One would say that Bromley's most marketable and sought-after works are his portraitures. His proficiency in the ancient form of portraiture resulted in various masterpieces that art aficionados get to own. Bromley's portrait subjects are habitually women and children, adapted from the world of 1950's book illustrations entitled 'Boys Own Annuals'. These are combined with an inventive relish for the effects of paint. His bestselling paintings, his nude portraits, are forged with an eye for recognising beauty and a certain finesse. One is able to discern that the nude series uses layering and texturing techniques to explore the female figure which tantalises the viewer with Bromley's suggestions of an underlying meaning. The most popular nude portrait is undoubtedly 'Rosie' and it comes as no surprise as Bromley's rendition of the model

is simply stunning. They say the eyes are the window to the soul; remarkably, Bromley has illustrated the very essence of the saying through his portraits. He is notorious for how well he captures the subject's eyes and lips and this extends to portraits of the children's series too. "For me, when it comes to portraits, it's always their eyes. It draws you into the paintina."

In a recent interview with KL Lifestyle magazine, Bromley revealed that the subject of his portraits initiated when he realised he looked at women in magazines with a sense of judgement. He then decided to materialise his sense of judgement by working on his own and asked his friends if he could photograph them. "I just wanted to try portraiture and just started doing it. I then realised it was so challenging," he admitted.



PORTRAITS OF KL LIFESTYLE MAGAZINE COVER GIRLS

When planning Bromley's inaugural solo exhibition in Malaysia, KL Lifestyle Art Space CEO Datuk Gary Thanasan, a fan and a friend of Bromley's had asked him if he would be comfortable painting portraits of local (Malaysian) flavours and to Datuk Gary's delight, he agreed. The portraitures Bromley was commissioned to concoct were subject close to home, the cover girls of KL Lifestyle magazine, such as Tengku Chanela Jamidah Amber Chia and Sheena Liam to name a few.

CHILDREN'S PORTRAITS

The children's portraits, differing greatly from the nudes, emanate a charm of their own. Through the portraits of his children's series, Bromley reminds its spectators of the playfu vet innocent soul of a child and carries its viewers to the land of lost content, to a world of action, dreams, of energy and reverie, of present pains and future hopes. Continuously drawing attention to the eyes, he depicts a different theme, one that is mysterious, allusive and indirect - like children. Adapting a Malaysian spin to his familiar children's portraits, Bromley produced two evocative paintings for KLAS entitled, 'Naeema' and 'Arissa'

COMMISSIONED WORKS

The commission process is something that is really special and Bromley loves the honour of creating a unique piece for people. Typically, the commission process would start with a meeting between the client and Bromley to take photographs and establish the style of painting and the personality of the client. This can also be done via skype and/or a photograph. Subsequently, they would need to also establish the size and detail of the painting that the client is interested in and a 50 percent deposit is required before the first consultation. Once the painting is completed, the final amount needs to be paid. It is a really simple process and one that he is always keen to be involved in

Bromley also points out that he does not appreciate those who feel art is exclusive to a certain class of people or community. "Art is music to the eyes. Anyone who can enjoy and appreciate it should have rights to it." The man is an extraordinary artist with down-to-earth personality, engaging his audience to relate, to feel, alongside him, through his works.

Enchanting Embrace of Khmer Culture

eel yourself enveloped with a sense of calm and tranquillity as you step
into the sanctum of serenity that is Park Hyatt.

Donning a contemporary design intertwined with the tangles of history, you'll find yourself entering into an exquisite haven of heritage and splendour. Getting around in Kuala Lumpur is easy. The transit systems are efficient, taxis are plenty and buses are cheap. The public transportation usage peak hours are from 7am to 9am and 4.30pm to 6.30pm during the working days.

By Transit systems

The KL monorail and LRT coaches are air-conditioned and comfortable and run from 6am to midnight. The systems are connected to each other at several points and the network covers most parts of the city. Fares range from RM0.90 to RM2.80 per single journey

By Taxis

Taxis are easily available at hotels or at taxi stands. Fares start at RM3 for the first kilometre and RMO.25 for every 115 metres thereon. There is a 50% surcharge on the metered fare from midnight to 6am and a baggage charge of RM2 per piece stored in the boot. There is also an additional RM1 for 3rd passenger (maximum 4 in a car). For an extra charge of RM2, you can book a taxi by phone.

By Ecovans

Ecovans can accommodate up to 5 passengers. They serve mainly guests at major hotels and follow the fare structure of taxis but charge RM4 instead of RM2 for the first kilometre.

By Buses

Buses serve all parts of Kuala Lumpur with fares beginning from RM1. Some hotels also offer free bus shuttle services to major shopping malls in the city.

GETTING TO THE AIRPORT

KLIA Ekspres: The journey takes about 28 minutes from KL Sentral and another 3 minutes to KLIA2. The fare is RM55 per person per way. There is also check-in facility at KL Sentral for some airlines.

Taxi: The fare from the city centre to the airport is RM90 - RM120 per taxi

Eco Transit: Eco Transit can accommodate up to 5 adults and has a fixed fare of RM130/ trip.

Limousine: Can be arranged with the hotel concierge and fare range from RM100 - RM200.
